# OFSAA Executive Director's Message

## REFLECTIONS OF MY TIME AT OFSAA ON THE OCCASION OF THE 75TH ANNIVERSARY

I have been retired from OFSAA for almost twenty years and live in Sidney B.C. on Vancouver Island, but hardly a day goes by without me being reminded what a great organization OFSAA is, and the important role that teachers, coaches and administrators play in providing sport programs for students in their schools. When I retired the Board of Directors gave me an OFSAA B.C.

licence plate for my car. This has generated all kinds of interest and interactions with individuals I meet. I have been stopped by people wanting to tell me about their OFSAA experiences, been “honked at” by people recognizing the plate, and even been told by two people who saw the plate that they had been given the OFSAA Colin Hood Leadership in School Sport Award. It seems that OFSAA will be part of their lives and my life forever.

What was really special about my OFSAA career was the great people I came into contact with on a regular basis. Where else in our lives would we walk into a gathering such as the luncheon celebrating the OFSAA 75th Anniversary, where every single person has the goal of enriching the lives of the students they teach, by giving their time to provide school sport experiences. I was privileged to work with outstanding Presidents and wonderful OFSAA staff who were hard working and supportive of each other in achieving OFSAA goals.

There were many highlights during my tenure as Executive Director. The inclusion of the Independent School Association as part of OFSAA was one that enriched the lives of both organizations. Peter Morris and the TDCAA made a major contribution to making this happen. Thirty years ago we had no festivals or bowls. Golf, tennis and ultimate frisbee were brought in as festivals. Executive Assistants, Jennifer Bennett, David Pineau and Steve Sevor worked hard to make this happen. When I started at OFSAA, football and baseball were run outside the purview of OFSAA. Not so today, thanks primarily to the work of Special Project Officer, Mike Thorpe. Another highlight for me was the work undertaken by Steve Sevor in developing the ‘Coaching in our Schools’ program. An important event for me every year, was OFSAA Track and Field. Special Project staff, Peter Morris and Bob Hancock always made sure it was a first class event. A major change in my first year was the full integration of physical disability events in the track and field program.

The first International School Sport event in North America,

was hosted in Collingwood by Jim Rhodes. Jim pioneered our involvement in this international body. We had teams at many events in Europe and I was invited to speak about OFSAA and Canadian school sport at the International Parliament in Strasbourg. Since then many of our schools have taken part in ISF events.

I must also highlight the work of the women’s committee in developing the principles and policies that ensured young women were treated equally in our programs and had equal opportunity to participate. Jennifer Bennett was able to use her considerable contacts and knowledge and work with the women’s committee and Diana Ranken to develop these principles and policies, which were forward thinking and made sure there was real gender equity in our programs.

A major achievement for me personally was nearly a tragedy. In the fall of 2001, the Ontario Government decided to increase the workload of teachers and so coaching suffered. The number of schools and students participating dropped significantly. We set guidelines for OFSAA Championships (must have 50% association representation and must have regular season of six games and a playoff structure). Two Associations ceased to operate during this period and numbers were getting worse day by the day. In January 2002, the Minister appointed me to a five-person committee to come up with a report to solve the problem. After three months we produced a report and embarked on a major PR campaign to promote the recommendations. When the report went to cabinet it was adopted, workloads went back to previous levels and so did coaching.

I have attended the 50th and the 75th anniversaries of OFSAA and, while I am pretty sure I will not be around for the 100th anniversary, what I do know is that at that time there will be another celebration featuring those providing school sport experiences and opportunities that the former Executive Director of the Manitoba High School Athletic Associations, Morris Glimcher called, the “Other Half of Education”.

It has been an honour and a privilege to have been part of the OFSAA journey.

# IN MEMORIAM

Her work at OELC as program co-ordinator and course director affirmed this dedication to leadership development in young adults.

She was an active executive member in the Kawartha District Athletic Association, COSSA and was the Women's Rep to OFSAA.

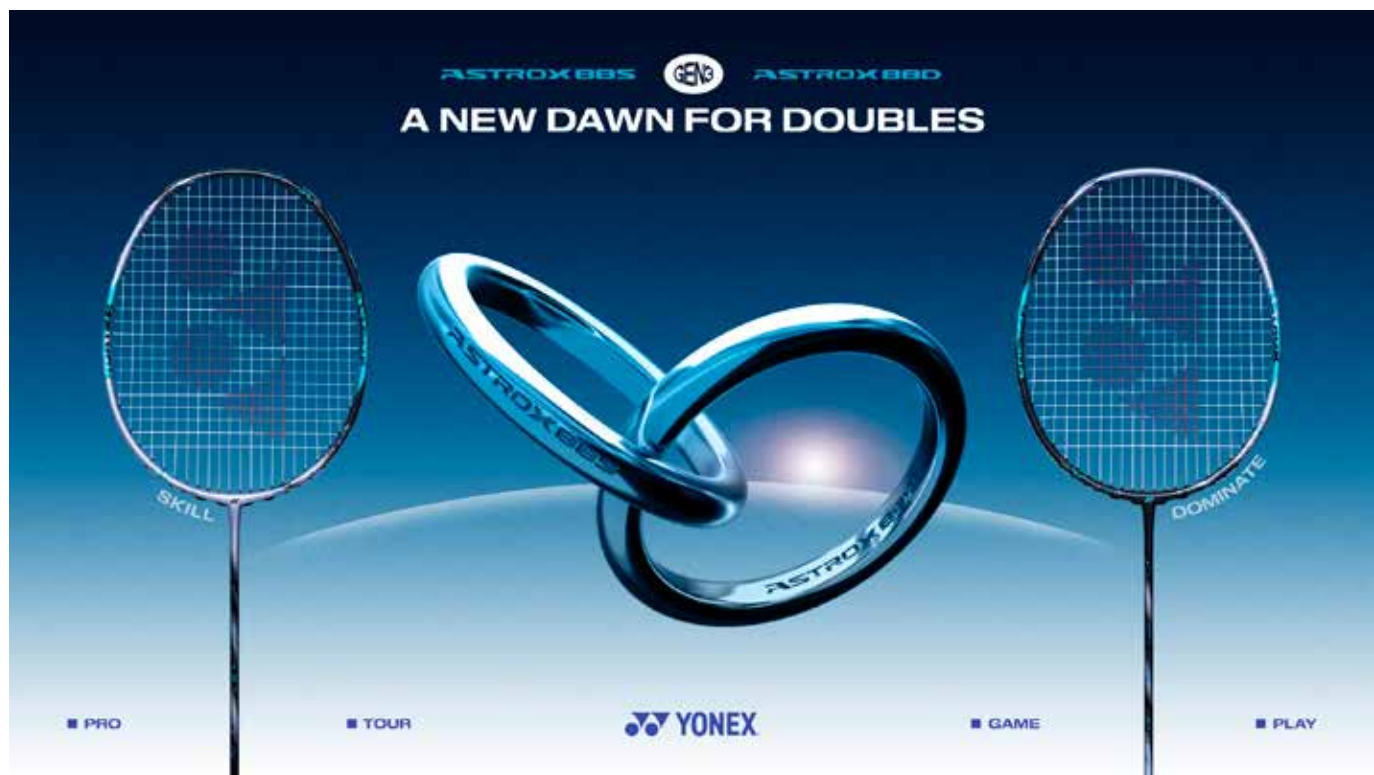
Leslie was a convenor of sport – her first love was basketball, but she was always quick to volunteer to schedule and co-ordinate any sport – so that student-athletes would have the opportunity to compete and be a part of a team.

In her coaching career – Leslie's boys and girls basketball teams won many Kawartha and COSSA championships and had several trips to OFSAA. She was also integral in organizing and co-ordinating all the Weldon Wildcat athletic teams. Many student-athletes from over the years have continued to be in touch and to offer their gratitude and support.

Leslie had always admired Terry Fox and had participated in the involvement of youth in his Marathon of Hope. With her own diagnosis in 2019 – she felt inspired by his efforts. She worked with the Terry Fox Foundation writing lesson plans for the school Terry Fox Run. Her connection was so strong that donations were directed to The Terry Fox Foundation in her memory.

Leslie was indeed a true teacher and leader! But the best thing about her was that she cared about everyone. Whether she was coaching or saw you out in the community – she would always ask "how are you?", and you knew she was genuinely interested.

She will be missed by all who knew her.

Thank you to those who joined us for the 2024 OFSAA Virtual Student Forum!

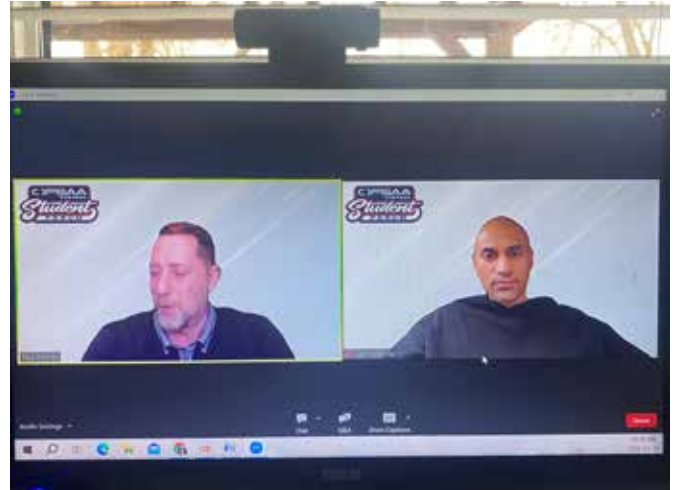

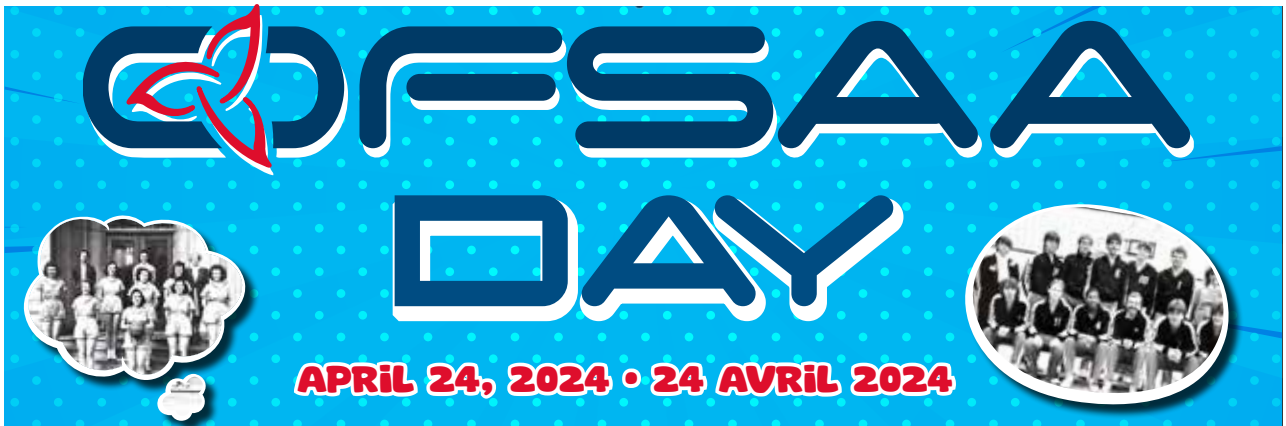

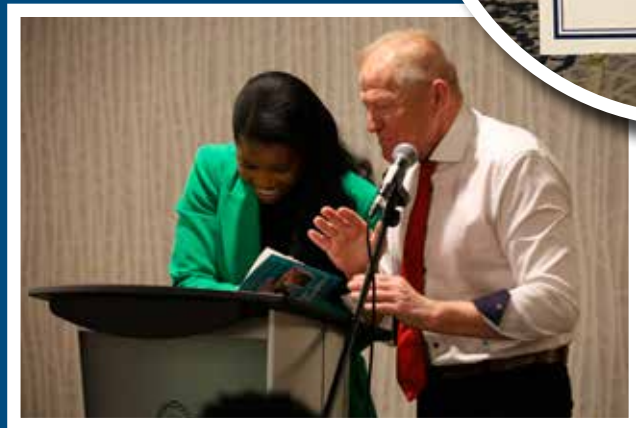

# Port Perry High School Leads By Example!

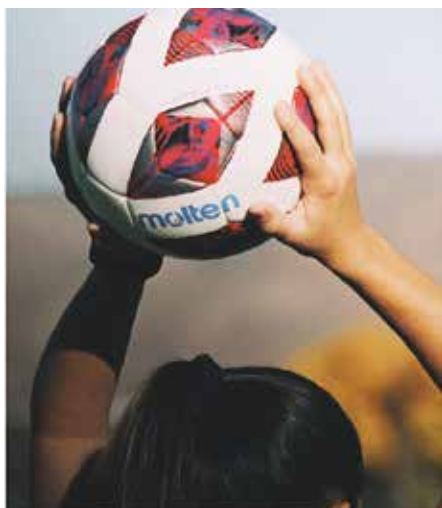


In a remarkable display of sportsmanship and athletic prowess, the Port Perry High School Rebels (LOSSA) achieved a remarkable feat at the 2023-24 OFSAA championships. The senior boys' volleyball, senior girls' volleyball, and curling teams were each awarded the prestigious **OFSAA Team Sportsmanship Award**. This award is given to one team at each championship, as chosen by the organizing committee, for demonstrating exemplary conduct and respect to players, officials, spectators and volunteers.

Gord Baxter is the school's Department Head of Math and serves as both the senior boys' and girls' volleyball coach:

"When representing our school and community, sportsmanship is a mandatory component of being a student athlete at PPHS. Like all athletic skills, Rebel athletic ambassadors are taught that sportsmanship requires practice. By regularly practicing and improving upon these sportsmanship skills, our teams are able to actively demonstrate sportsmanship during matches without losing focus on our primary goal of competitive success.

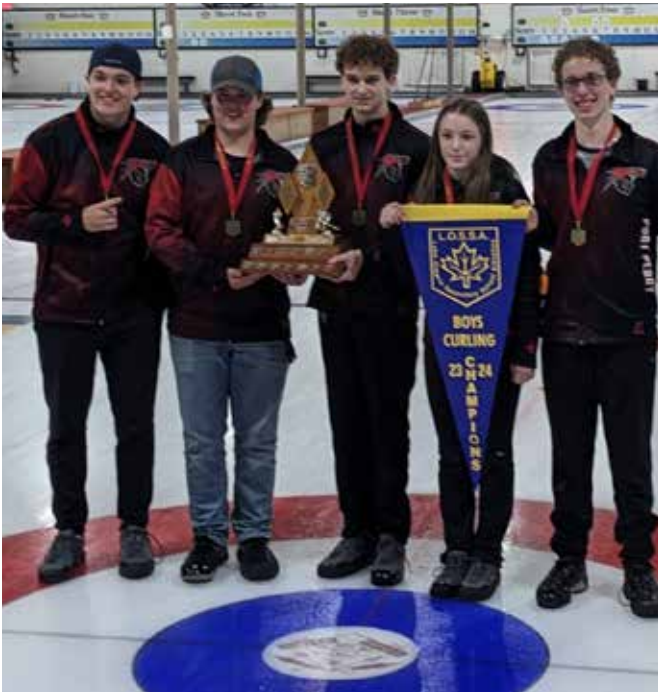

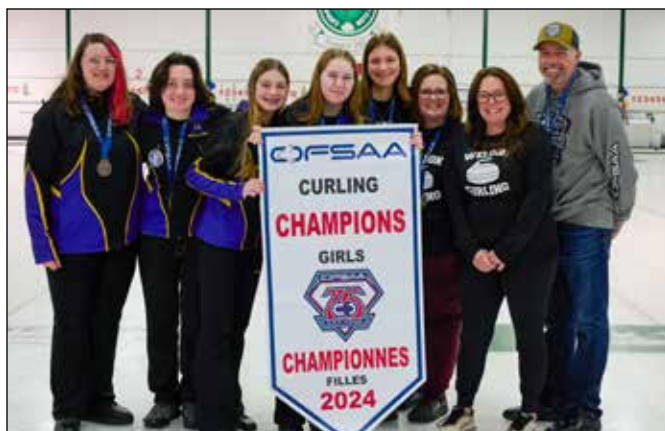

# OFSAA Swimming Championship

Scarborough

March 5 – 6, 2024



The 2023-24 OFSAA Swimming Championship returned to the Toronto Pan Am Sports Centre for the first time since March of 2020. 3038 student-athletes representing 354 high schools from each of OFSAA's 18 member Associations came to the GTA to participate in this year's

event. The total number of qualifiers set a new record for participation in an OFSAA Swimming Championship. But while these extraordinary numbers presented numerous additional challenges to the organizing committee, Convenor Tim White (CISAA) and his hardworking committee did a fantastic job of hosting student-athletes, teacher-coaches and spectators at the championship. The success of the event was also due, in large part, because of the number of well-organized student volunteers and community swimming officials who helped over the two days.

As in past years, live streaming has been critical in bringing the event to individuals who could not otherwise attend the championships. This year, there were a total of 23,340 viewing sessions that allowed people from 42 countries to watch our student-athletes compete.

This year's OFSAA Leadership in School Sport Award was presented to long-time teacher-coach Christine Harris. Christine has been involved in high school sport for the past 14 years in a variety of capacities.

As well as being involved in soccer, swimming and triathlon at St. Andrew's College and St. Anne's School in Aurora, Christine has also been active in a number of different convenorships, athletic councils and committees during her time as a teacher-coach and is a most deserving recipient of this award.
