Charles M. Griffin

Charles M. Griffin, Business Manager: Griffin, a native of Siloam, Ga., attended high school at Richmond Academy in Augusta, and was graduated in 1925. He entered Georgia Tech that Fall and received his degree in Ceramics Engineering in 1930.

His last two years as a student he worked in the business office of the Athletic Association under Dr. A. H. Armstrong, and became a full time assistant upon graduation.

He succeeded Dr. Armstrong in 1946 as Business Manager.

Griffin, born July 19, 1908, is a member of ANAK, the oldest senior honor society on the campus. After his graduation from Tech, Griffin studied law at Emory University.

Edward (Chick) Hosch, Athletic Publicity Director: Hosch, born at Gulfport, Miss., Sept. 25, 1911, came to Georgia Tech on July 1, 1948 after four years as Southern Sports Editor for The Associated Press. For two years prior to that he had served as a reporter for AP.

He attended Mississippi State, receiving his degree in 1938 after which he took graduate work and handled publicity for the college. In 1940 he became editor of the Gulf Coast Examiner at Biloxi and the next year joined the staff of the Daily Herald at Gulfport. In the 1942 campaign he was publicity director for James O. Eastland, who was elected to the United States Senate as a successor to the late Sen. Pat Harrison.
