Jackets, Bulldogs Renew Long-Time Rivalry

• Georgia Tech and Georgia meet for the 108th time on the football field Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium in the regular-season finale for both teams and Senior Day for the Yellow Jackets.
• The game can be seen on ABC with Bob Wischusen, Rod Gilmore and Quint Kessenich.
• On the radio, "Voice of the Yellow Jackets" Brandon Gaudin has the call on the Georgia Tech IMG Sports Network along with analyst Rick Strom and sideline reporter Randy Waters. The game can be heard on WYAY 106.7 FM in Atlanta and on the web at RamblinWreck.com.

Quick Hitters

• Georgia Tech has won four of its last five and enters Saturday's game still alive for at least a share of the ACC Coastal Division title, which would be Tech's fourth in six seasons under head coach Paul Johnson.
• At 5-3 in the league, Tech finishes at .500 or better for 19th consecutive season in conference play, to extend the nation's longest such streak.
• In the five previous seasons under Paul Johnson, the Jackets' average preseason predicted finish in the Coastal Division was third place (3.0), with Tech's average actual finish checking in at 1.6 (an ACC-best difference of +1.4). This season, Tech was picked fourth, and at 5-3, can do no worse than a tie for second.
• Saturday's game between Tech and Georgia marks the 108th in the series that dates back to 1893, and the rivalry is the 17th-oldest in college football based on number of games.
• Georgia Tech, Ohio State and Wisconsin are the only teams in the nation to rank in the top 10 nationally in both rushing offense and rushing defense. The Jackets rank fourth in rush offense, 10th in rush defense.
• Georgia Tech is tied for fourth nationally in third-down percentage (.531) – the third time in Paul Johnson's six seasons that the Yellow Jackets have ranked in the top five nationally in that category.
• Tech is averaging 316.1 rushing yards per game, which ranks fourth in the nation. The Yellow Jackets will face a Georgia defense that allows just 138.1 rushing yards per game.
• The Yellow Jackets join Southern Cal as the only teams in the nation to rank in the top 15 nationally in both red-zone offense (13th) and red-zone defense (12th). Tech leads the FBS in red-zone TD percentage (.857).
• According to ESPN Stats & Info, Tech and Duke are the nation's only two teams to convert 100% of Goal-to-Go opportunities into touchdowns this season. The Jackets are 28-for-28, the Blue Devils are 22-for-22.
• Georgia ranks 15th nationally in total offense (494.6), while Georgia Tech ranks 17th nationally in total defense (342.6).
• Senior DE Jeremiah Attaochu continues to threaten Georgia Tech's career sacks record and he enters the Georgia game needing four sacks to tie Greg Gathers' record of 31.0.
• Attaochu's 27.0 career sacks are the third-most among all active FBS players.
• Senior A-back Robert Godhigh is one of the nation's most explosive all-around players. The 5-foot-7 former walk-on has logged 961 yards from scrimmage (623 rush, 338 catch) and his average of 13.0 yards per play leads all running backs in the FBS. Of his offensive touches, 55 percent result in first downs or touchdowns.
• Godhigh has 13 plays from scrimmage of 30+ yards, which is the fifth-most among all FBS players.
• Of Godhigh's 961 yards, 389 yards (40.5 percent) have come after contact.
• Georgia Tech is celebrating the 100th anniversary of Historic Grant Field in 2013. It is the most tenured stadium in the FBS and listed by ESPN.com as a bucket-list item for college fans.

Tech Notebook

- Tech's four losses this season were to teams that are all bowl eligible with a combined record of 32-12.
- Tech began the season 3-0, marking the second 3-0 start in the last three years, but just the third in the last 12 years. Tech started 2-0 in the ACC for the second time under Paul Johnson (2011).
- The Jackets have defeated Elon 70-0, Syracuse 56-0 and Alabama A&M 66-7 this season to move Paul Johnson to 20-0 at Tech when surpassing the 40-point plateau.
- The shutouts to Elon and Syracuse mark Tech's first since 2008 -- and mark the first time since 1985 that the Jackets recorded two shutouts in the same season.
- Tech's 38-14 win at Duke was the Jackets' 10th consecutive win in the series.
- Overcoming two different 13-point deficits, Tech defeated UNC, 28-20 -- its fifth straight win over the Heels.
- Tech scored 136 points through its first three games in 2013 -- the second-most through three games over the program's last 50 seasons.
- In the 17-10 setback to VT, the Jackets had two fourth-quarter possessions with a chance to tie the game.
- Tech led Miami 17-0 in the first quarter, and was within one (24-23) in the fourth quarter before three straight Hurricane touchdowns.
- Tech's margin of victory in the Syracuse win (56-0) was its largest ever in an ACC game and ranks as the eighth-largest by all teams in ACC conference games.
- Tech has amassed more than 400 yards of total offense in nine of the 11 games this season -- Virginia Tech (273) and Pitt (360) held Tech below 400.
- Zach Laskey (133), Robert Godhigh (111) and David Sims (107) all rushed for 100 yards in the Virginia win -- the first time in modern Georgia Tech history (since 1950) that three different Yellow Jackets have rushed for 100 yards.
- The Jackets beat both of the ACC's newcomers -- Pitt and Syracuse -- by a combined score of 77-10.
- Robert Godhigh racked up 229 all-purpose yards at Clemson (126 rushing, 103 receiving) and became the first Jacket since Orwin Smith in 2011 to rush and receive for 100 yards in a game.

Seniors Say Farewell

• For 17 Georgia Tech seniors, Saturday's game against Georgia will be their final game in Bobby Dodd Stadium. Over the last four years, this senior class has played in three bowl games (and will play in a fourth) and played in the 2012 ACC Championship game. Many redshirted as true freshmen in 2009 when Tech played in the ACC title game and the Orange Bowl.

Tech's ACC Title Outlook

The Yellow Jackets are right in the thick of another ACC Coastal Division race, which all comes down to the final Saturday of the regular season. Listed below are the scenarios for the contending teams:

- If Duke wins on the road at North Carolina Saturday, the Blue Devils will play in the ACC Championship game against Florida State.

- If Duke loses at North Carolina, Georgia Tech will own at least a share of the Coastal Division title.
- If Virginia Tech wins at Virginia Saturday, the Yellow Jackets have no chance of advancing to the ACC Championship game.
- If two teams tie for the Coastal Division crown, Georgia Tech holds tie-breakers with Duke and North Carolina, and Miami and Virginia Tech hold tie-breakers with the Yellow Jackets.
- If three or more teams are tied, see the ACC's tie-breaker formula (see Page 7).

Snapshots In the Tech-UGA Series

Nov. 26, 1949: Tech 7, Georgia 6. The Grant Field victory that started "The Drought," Bobby Dodd's eight-year mastery of Georgia.

Dec. 1, 1984: Tech 35, Georgia 18. In Athens, this was Curry's turnaround game for the program, one that ended a six-game losing streak to UGA.

Dec. 2, 1989: Tech 33, Georgia 22. Jerry Mays ran for 207 yards to help complete a remarkable 7-4 Tech turnaround after an 0-3 start.

Nov. 28, 1998: Tech 21, Georgia 19, in Athens. Brad Chambers' 35-yard field goal in the final seconds ended a seven-game losing streak to UGA.

Nov. 27, 1999: Tech 51, Georgia 48, in overtime. In the most thrilling game in Bobby Dodd Stadium annals, Joe Hamilton's last home game was triumphant. Luke Manget's second-chance, OT field goal sent Tech fans into euphoria. Many of them carried Hamilton -- who was second in the Heisman Trophy voting that season -- on their shoulders and around the stadium.

Nov. 29, 2008: Georgia Tech 45, Georgia 42 (Athens). Paul Johnson's first Yellow Jacket team overcame 26-12 halftime deficit to break seven-year skid against a Bulldog team that was ranked No. 1 in the preseason. Freshman Roddy Jones ran for 214 yards.

Georgia Tech-Georgia Series History

- Georgia leads the all-time series, 63-39-5 (Georgia lists the series as 63-37-5; the NCAA recognizes the series as 63-39-5).

- The 107 all-time meetings between the two teams make Tech-UGA the 17th-most frequently played series among FBS schools.

- Among rivalries between two in-state teams in separate conferences, the rivalry ranks fifth for most games played (see below).

- Tech has played Georgia more often than any other opponent.

- Georgia has won the last four and 11 out of the last 12 meetings.

- Georgia holds a 33-26-4 series advantage in games played in Atlanta. The Bulldogs have won the last six meetings at Historic Grant Field. Tech's last victory against the Bulldogs in Atlanta came in 1999.

- The Bulldogs hold a 30-13-1 series advantage for games played in Athens.

- At least one of the two teams has been nationally ranked in 15 of the last 16 meetings (both teams were unranked in 2010 en route to identical 6-6 records).

- Saturday's game marks just the second time since 1996 that either Georgia Tech or Georgia was not ranked in the AP top 25 when the Yellow Jackets and Bulldogs have met.

- The winning team has scored at least 30 points in each of the last six meetings.

- The Yellow Jackets and Bulldogs first met on the gridiron in 1893 (28-6 Tech victory). The two teams have met every season since 1925.

- Georgia Tech was a member of the SEC from 1933-63 and holds an all-time record of 205-213-24 against teams currently in the SEC.

- Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson is 1-5 all-time against Georgia, that includes one loss while coaching at Georgia Southern.

- Last year Tech's opponents averaged 2.52 points per possession. This season, just 1.67.
- Tech has allowed 30 touchdowns this season. Last year the Yellow Jackets allowed 51 touchdowns.
- The Jackets did not allow a play from scrimmage of over 17 yards in the win over Pittsburgh.
- Tech's defense has allowed just six running plays of 20 yards or more.

- Since the ACC began divisional play in 2005, Georgia Tech has won the third-most conference games in that span. Tech has averaged five ACC wins over this eight-year span and claimed the Coastal three times.

Model Of Consistency

- Finishing 5-3 in the ACC this season, Georgia Tech clinched its 19th consecutive season of finishing .500 or better in conference play -- extending the nation's longest such streak.
- Tech has won 47 games over the last six seasons combined for an average of 7.8 wins per season.
- Including the 2013 season, the Jackets have finished .500 or better overall in 15 of the last 16 seasons.

The Little Guy Makes Big Plays

- Robert Godhigh is a remarkable story. The 5-foot-7 A-back came to Georgia Tech as a walk-on and toiled on the scout team for two years. As a sophomore in 2011, he emerged as a blocking specialist and saw duty as a reserve. He's now started 24 consecutive games, including all 14 last year.

- He's Tech's most proficient at moving the chains -- 55 percent of his offensive touches result in first downs or touchdowns (29 of 57 rushes and 12 of 17 catches).

- He's even better on third downs, touching the ball nine times, averaging 10.6 yards from scrimmage and logging seven first downs.

- He put up career numbers at Clemson where he set career highs in both rushing (126) and receiving (103), becoming the first Tech player since 2011 to rush and catch for 100 yards in a game. He had four plays from scrimmage of 30+ yards at Clemson and scored twice on the ground.

- A big-play machine, Godhigh has exploded for 13 plays from scrimmage of 30+ yards, which ranks fourth in the NCAA.

- Among running backs nationally, Godhigh's 13.0 all-purpose yards per play average is the highest.

- Of Godhigh's 961 yards from scrimmage this season, 389 yards (40.5 percent) have come after contact.

- His last three games vs. ACC foes have been significant -- 23 carries, 326 yards, 14.2 avg., five touchdowns.

- Of all the players in the history of the ACC who rushed for 1,000 career yards, Godhigh's 9.47 yards per carry average stands as the ACC record. Tech players occupy seven of the top 11 spots on the ACC's career list.

- Godhigh has 16 career touchdowns, including six over the last four games. Ten of his 16 career TDs have been via rushing, six via receiving. Eleven of his 15 touchdowns have come on the road.
- More noteworthy is that 13 of Godhigh's 16 career touchdowns have come in the second half.
- Tech is 9-2 in games that Godhigh reaches the end zone.

Running For Miles

- Since Paul Johnson arrived on Georgia Tech's campus prior to the 2008 season -- Tech has rushed for more yards than any FBS team in the nation.
- The Jackets have surpassed 23,000 yards rushing since 2008 and are the only team averaging more than 300 yards on the ground in that span.
- Since 2008, Tech's 23,839 yards equates to 13.5 miles.

- Georgia Tech has scored 36 touchdowns on its 42 red-zone possessions this season, and its touchdown percentage of 85.7 leads the FBS.
- Tech is 13th nationally (third in the ACC) in overall Red Zone offense, scoring 90.5 percent of the time (36 touchdowns, 2 field goals).
- Defensively, the Jackets have been just as proficient -- ranking first in the ACC and 12th nationally by allowing 23 scores (20 touchdowns, 3 field goals) in 32 opponent possessions (71.9).

Efficient Offense

- Georgia Tech has reached the end zone on 43 percent of its drives this season (55 of 129), the eighth-highest percentage in the FBS of turning drives into touchdowns.
- Florida State is the national leader, scoring touchdowns on 54 percent of its drives.
- The Yellow Jackets are also 10th nationally in fewest offensive three-and-outs, logging just 26 this season -- a percentage of 19.3.

Four 1,000-Yard Rushers?

- There have been 42 players in Georgia Tech history to rush for 1,000 career yards. Sophomore quarterback Vad Lee, who has 970 rushing yards in two seasons, hopes to be the 43rd soon.
- When Lee gets his 1,000th yard, he will be the fourth current Yellow Jacket to reach the milestone. Senior David Sims (2,114 yards) joined the 1,000-yard club last season. Both junior Zach Laskey (1,143) and senior Robert Godhigh (1,070) got their 1,000th yard earlier this season.
- Remarkably, Godhigh has accumulated 1,070 yards on just 113 rushing attempts.
- Only four quarterbacks in Tech history rushed for more career yards than Lee.

Attaochu Closes In On Sack Records

- Senior DE and all-star candidate Jeremiah Attaochu recorded his 26th and 27th career sacks at Clemson, putting him into sole possession of fourth place on Tech's all-time career sacks list. Attaochu needs four sacks to tie the school record of 31.0 held by Greg Gathers (1999-02).
- Attaochu (206 career sack yards) is even closer to the Tech record for career sack yards. Only Gathers (210 yards) has more.
- The senior is on a late-season sack surge, collecting seven sacks over Tech's last seven games (six over the last four games), after accounting for just one over the first four games.
- Attaochu is third among active FBS players in career sacks.
- Even without another sack this season, Attaochu would be Georgia Tech's most prolific sack-producer in more than 10 years. His 27.0 career sacks tie for the 13th-most in the history of the ACC. Attaochu is 3.5 sacks shy of tying Julius Peppers for the sixth-most sacks in ACC history.
- Attaochu's 39.0 career tackles for loss are the seventh-most in Tech history. His next TFL will tie him for sixth with Keyaron Fox.
- He made the move in the offseason from linebacker to end, and the sack production has continued.
- Attaochu was on the preseason watch lists for the four major defensive awards that defensive lineman qualify for -- the Bednarik, the Hendricks, the Lombardi and the Nagurski. He was one of only eight players nationally to appear on all four awards, joined by Morgan Breslin (USC), Jadeveon Clowney (South Carolina), Scott Crichton (Oregon State), Devonte Field (TCU), Jackson Jeffcoat (Texas), Chris Smith (Arkansas) and Stephon Tuitt (Notre Dame).

- Seven of Thomas' eight career INTs have come in the fourth quarter, including four in which Georgia Tech led by two touchdowns or less.
- Tech is 5-2 in games that Thomas has an interception (he had two INTs in one game, vs. Clemson in 2011).
- All eight of his interceptions have come in ACC games.
- Thomas' fourth-quarter INT in the 2012 ACC Championship Game gave Tech the ball with a chance to tie or take the lead in the eventual loss to Florida State.
- Thomas' interceptions have come against some of the top quarterbacks in recent ACC history, including Clemson Heisman Trophy candidate Tajh Boyd and current NFL players E.J. Manuel and Sean Renfree.

• Jemea Thomas is just the 11th Yellow Jacket in history to play 50+ career games, and will tie Tech's record of 54 games played should he play Saturday and the bowl game.

• Jemea Thomas, nicknamed "iPod" by his teammates, had a monster game at Virginia, making a career-high 15 tackles (12 solo) and breaking up two passes. It was the most tackles by a Tech player since Morgan Burnett made 16 versus Georgia in 2009.

• He was named the ACC's co-Defensive Back of the Week for the UVa effort -- Thomas' second career ACC weekly honor and first since 2011. He repeated as the ACC's DBOW on Nov. 4 following the Pitt win.

• Thomas had a team-high seven tackles in the 56-0 win over Syracuse and his strip sack of QB Terrel Hunt was a key play in the second quarter that gave Tech the ball and a short field.

• Says defensive coordinator Ted Roof: "He's one of the best corners I've ever coached...he finishes with a purpose."

Tech, Duke Lead FBS In Goal-to-Go TD Percentage

• According to data from ESPN Stats & Info, Georgia Tech and Duke are the nation's only two teams to convert 100% of their Goal-to-Go opportunities into touchdowns this season. The Yellow Jackets are 28-for-28, with all 28 scores being rushing touchdowns, while Duke is 22-for-22.

• David Sims has scored a team-high seven times in Goal-to-Go situations, followed by QB Vad Lee (six), B-back Zack Laskey (five), A-back Synjyn Days (four), A-back Robert Godhigh (two), B-back Matt Connors (two) and one each from Deon Hill and Charles Perkins.

Backfield Leader

Senior B-back David Sims has put together back-to-back strong seasons and is on pace to finish his career with over 2,200 yards rushing. The St. Matthews, S.C., native rushed for 612 yards and four touchdowns last season, battling through a nagging injury.

• Sims and Ohio State's Carlos Hyde are the only two running backs in the nation with one or fewer negative rushes this season (min. 100 attempts).

• In fact, Sims's first and only negative rush this season came at Clemson, snapping a streak of 171 consecutive carries without going in reverse, dating to last November vs. Duke.

• Sims has reached the end zone at least once in 12 of the last 16 games.

• After setting his career high of 99 yards on two previous occasions, Sims finally broke the 100-yard rushing mark this season at Virginia -- and his second of two rushing touchdowns put the game on ice with 1:55 left in the fourth quarter.

• The senior had another 100-yard effort last week versus Alabama A&M, rushing eight times for 111 yards (13.9 avg.) and a touchdown, and reeling in one pass for 12 yards.

• Sims is sixth in the ACC in rushing (67.8), and ranks seventh with a 70.9-yard average in ACC games.

Sims Career Milestone Watch

• David Sims (2,114 career rushing yards) ranks 12th in Tech history. He is 112 yards shy of overtaking former QB Tevin Washington (2009-12) in 11th place.

• He surpassed 2,000 career yards at Clemson, becoming just the 13th 2,000-yard rusher in school history.

• For his career, Sims averages 5.19 yards per carry, which ranks 12th in Tech history.

• With his 23 career rushing touchdowns, he has tied PJ Daniels (2002-05) in seventh place. Sims needs five more to catch current Buffalo Bill Tashard Choice (28) in sixth.

Tech Schedule Proving Tougher

• Georgia Tech has played only two FBS team with a current record below .500 (Virginia, Syracuse). Including Georgia, eight teams on the schedule are bowl eligible, while Syracuse (5-6) is one win shy.

• Tech has wins over a pair of ACC teams that have combined to win 12-straight games -- Duke 7, UNC 5.

• Four teams on the schedule are either currently ranked or receiving votes in at least one poll.

• Tech is ranked 28th in the most recent Sagarin ratings, with a schedule strength of 40.

• Every ACC team faces two 'crossover' opponents from the other division each year, including one 'permanent' crossover. In the case of Georgia Tech, its permanent crossover partner is Clemson. The Jackets also played Syracuse this season as their rotating crossover opponent. Among the top four teams in the Coastal -- Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech, Miami and Duke -- the Jackets are playing the most difficult crossover schedule.

• Virginia Tech, Duke and UNC don't play Clemson or Florida State in the regular season.

Rarely Blanked

• Georgia Tech enters the Georgia game having played 209 consecutive games without being shut out. That's the eighth-longest active streak nationally. The last time the Yellow Jackets were blanked came on Oct. 18, 1997, a 38-0 loss at third-ranked Florida State.

• Perhaps more impressive, Georgia Tech has not been shut out at home since Nov. 30, 1957, a 7-0 loss to Georgia. That's a streak of 352 consecutive games at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being held scoreless.

Special Teams Are Special

Georgia Tech took a huge blow to its special teams earlier this year when junior Jamal Golden suffered a season-ending shoulder injury, but the Yellow Jackets have done just fine in the return game and have excelled in other areas of special teams.

• The Yellow Jackets are one of only three teams in the nation with three blocked three punts, and all three coming from sophomore Chris Milton.

• Senior punter Sean Poole, a candidate for the Ray Guy Award, is being punished (figuratively) because of Georgia Tech's proficiency on offense. Poole does not have enough punt attempts to qualify for the ACC statistics, where he would rank third in punting average (44.1), and the NCAA statistics, where he would rank 14th.

• With Golden sidelined, newcomer DeAndre Smelter has averaged 12.0 yards on his 10 punt returns and he would rank fifth in the ACC and 14th nationally if he had enough attempts to qualify.

• True freshman kicker Harrison Butker has kicked five field goals longer than 40 yards -- he's 7-of-10 overall -- and he ranks ninth in the ACC in points-by-kicking.

• Butker's average distanced on his seven made field goals is 42.4 yards.

• Only two players in Tech history kicked more PATs in one season than Butker (47) this year.

• As a team, Tech ranks 26th nationally in net punting.

Chasing 25,000 Points

• With one regular season game and a bowl game remaining on the schedule, Georgia Tech has an opportunity to score its 25,000th all-time point before Tech's 121st season of football comes to a conclusion. Tech needs 42 points over those two games combined to reach 25,000.

Georgia Tech is in the middle of a season-long celebration of Historic Grant Field's 100th anniversary.

To mark the anniversary, a special logo (right) was created.

The highlight of the celebration came Sept. 26 when the Yellow Jackets hosted the Virginia Tech Hokies in an ESPN Thursday night game. Georgia Tech wore throw-back uniforms and every player who ever earned All-American status was back to campus.



Tech Adds To Strong Bowl Tradition

Georgia Tech has clinched six wins and is bowl eligible, meaning the Yellow Jackets will play in their 17th consecutive bowl game this season. That streak is now tied for the third-longest active streak. Tech trails only Florida State (32), Virginia Tech (21) -- FSU and VT have also clinched bowl-eligibility in 2013.

Florida entered the season with the nation's second-longest streak at 22, but will not qualify for a bowl in 2013.

The last time the Yellow Jackets failed to make a bowl game was 1996, when most members of this year's freshmen class were one-year old.

Tech made its 41st bowl appearance overall in 2012, tying for the 12th-most nationally.

With a record of 23-18, Tech has the ninth-highest bowl winning percentage nationally and the 10th-most bowl wins.

Georgia Tech was the first school to win each of the four traditional major bowls -- the Rose, Orange, Sugar and Cotton. It completed that feat in 1955.

Following the 2009 season, Tech played in a BCS bowl game -- the Orange Bowl -- against Iowa.

Tech's first bowl game was the 1929 Rose Bowl -- the famous "Wrong Way Riegels" game against Cal.

Tech's Future Schedules Have Peach Flavor

Georgia Tech filled an opening in its future non-conference football schedules by agreeing to play the Mercer Bears in 2016. Mercer, which resumed football competition this fall after 72 years of dormancy, compete on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. As part of the agreement, Mercer must increase its scholarship numbers by 2016 to meet the minimum standards set by the NCAA.

The addition of Mercer in 2016 is in line with Georgia Tech's plan to schedule in-state non-conference opponents. The Yellow Jackets will host Georgia Southern in 2014 -- the first-ever meeting between the two teams -- and Tech continues to play rival Georgia annually.

ACC FOOTBALL TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE

Three team (or more) tiebreaker procedure will be used to break all ties to identify the Championship game representative. Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaking procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can only be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaking procedure will then be applied.

1. Combined head-to-head winning percentage among the tied teams.
2. Winning percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference winning percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaking procedures.
4. Combined winning percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined winning percentage versus all non-divisional opponents.
6. Winning percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference winning percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaking procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If all tied teams are not ranked in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings, the computer ranking portion of the Standings will be used, eliminating the high and the low computer ranking, and averaging the remaining rankings.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

Paul Johnson: Impressive Numbers

- Johnson was the first coach in ACC history to be named Coach of the Year in each of his first two seasons.
- Only four coaches in ACC history won more games in their first four seasons than Johnson.
- Johnson is 6-2 at home against top 25 opponents.
- Johnson has at least eight wins in 13 of his 16 seasons as a head coach.
- Since head coach Johnson arrived at Georgia Tech, his Yellow Jacket teams have averaged 8.2 wins per season – the most of any Tech head coach. In second is Bobby Dodd, whose teams averaged 7.5 wins per year over 22 seasons.
- In 15 of the Jackets' 47 wins under Johnson, Tech trailed by seven points or more.
- A Yellow Jacket has earned Academic All-ACC honors 16 times in Paul Johnson's five seasons at Georgia Tech, and Tech's APR score has improved in each season under Johnson.
- Tech has scored 18 non-offensive touchdowns in Paul Johnson's five seasons as head coach (including three this season).
- Only four teams in Georgia Tech history rushed for 300 yards per game. Three of those teams have been under Johnson.
- In six seasons at Tech, Paul Johnson is 12-5 in games decided by five points or less. Since '04, when Johnson was at Navy, his teams are 25-11 in games decided by five points or less.
- Johnson has defeated all 13 other ACC opponents at least once, including newcomers Pitt and Syracuse.

Johnson Exceeds Expectations

- No other team in the ACC has exceeded expectations like Georgia Tech, since Paul Johnson's arrival on the Flats in 2008.
- In the five seasons under Johnson, the Yellow Jackets' average pre-season predicted finish in the Coastal Division has been third place (3.0), with Tech's average actual finish checking in at 1.6 (a difference of +1.4).
- The Jackets were pegged fourth in the Coastal Division in this season's pre-season media poll, behind Miami, Virginia Tech and North Carolina -- Tech plays those three games in succession between Sept. 21 and Oct. 5.
