### TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech hits the road for the first time this season on Saturday when it travels to No. 17/19 Ole Miss.
- Despite being members of the Southeastern Conference together from the conference's inaugural season in 1933 until Georgia Tech's departure following the 1963 campaign, the Yellow Jackets are making their first-ever trip to Ole Miss. The Jackets and Rebels have met five times previously — twice at Tech (1946 and 2022) and three times in bowl games (1953 Sugar, 1971 Peach and 2013 Music City). Ole Miss leads the all-time series, 3-2.
- Saturday's matchup pits two of college football's most prolific offenses, as Georgia Tech and Ole Miss are ranked ninth and 13th, respectively, in total offense this season.

The high-powered offenses are led by two of the nation's top quarterbacks in Georgia Tech's **Haynes King** (sixth nationally in touchdown passes, 12th in passing yards per game, 12th in total offense and 15th in passing efficiency) and Ole Miss's Jaxon Dart (third in passing efficiency, ninth in TD passes, 11th in total offense and 13th in passing yards per game).

Georgia Tech head coach **Brent Key** and Ole Miss head coach Lane Kiffin served on the staff together at Alabama in 2016, when Kiffin was in his third and final season as the Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach and Key was in his first of three seasons as the Tide's offensive line coach.

Georgia Tech went 2-1 last season in road games against nationally ranked opponents, with wins at No. 24 Pitt (26-21 on Oct. 1) and at No. 13/11 North Carolina (21-17 on Nov. 19).

**GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS**

**1**  
 Georgia Tech is the only team in NCAA Division I FBS that ranks in the top 20 nationally in both passing offense (18th) and rushing offense (20th) this season.

**1**  
 Despite being members of the Southeastern Conference together for 31 seasons (1933-63), Georgia Tech is making its first-ever visit to Ole Miss. The teams only played each other in the regular season once in Tech's 31 seasons in the SEC (a 24-7 Georgia Tech win in Atlanta in 1946).

**2**  
 With an interception, forced fumble and fumble recovery in last Saturday's win over South Carolina State, Georgia Tech Jr. DL **Kyle Kennard** became only the second Yellow Jacket since 2000 to record an INT, FF and FR in a single game (joining Bruce Jordan-Swilling, who accomplished the feat against Virginia in 2017).

 Head coach **Brent Key** is the fifth Georgia Tech alumnus to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

 Georgia Tech picked up the 750th win in program history last Saturday against South Carolina State. Georgia Tech is the 21st program in FBS history with 750 all-time victories, and the fourth from the ACC (joining Clemson, Virginia Tech and Pitt).

**A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...**

- snap a seven-game losing streak against SEC opponents.

**GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY**

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was officially named the 21st head coach in Tech football history by Institute President Dr. Ángel Cabrera and director of athletics J Batt on Nov. 29, 2022.

Key takes the reins of the program after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents – a 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt in his first game at the helm on Oct. 1 and a 21-17 triumph at No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 19. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries – including to its top two quarterbacks – to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. The overall and conference win totals were Tech's highest since 2018, as was its fourth-place finish in the ACC Coastal Division standings (the Jackets defeated all three teams that finished ahead of them in the division standings – North Carolina, Pitt and Duke).

A 2001 Georgia Tech graduate (management), Key is the fifth Tech alumnus to serve as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, joining William Alexander (1912 graduate; head coach from 1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1956; 1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1955; 1974-79) and Bill Curry (1965; 1980-86). Key played offensive line for the Jackets from 1997-2000.

Prior to being named Georgia Tech's interim head coach on Sept. 26 of last season, Key was in his fourth season as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach, run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In his four seasons at his alma mater, Georgia Tech's run game produced an all-American, three all-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees and finished in the top half of the ACC in rushing offense twice. Key has also mentored a pair of all-ACC offensive linemen.

Despite battling a rash of injuries across the offensive front throughout the season, 2021 marked the second-straight season that Tech's rushing offense ranked in the top half of the ACC under Key's watch, with tackle Devin Cochran earning honorable-mention all-ACC recognition before going on to sign with the National Football League's Cincinnati Bengals.

In 2020, the Jackets ranked fourth in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed (2.3 per game) and fifth in the league in rushing (190.8 yards per game), all with a true freshman (Jordan Williams) starting 9-of-10 games at right tackle.

Despite a multitude of injuries, the Jackets' offensive line improved throughout the 2019 season, as it went through the monumental transition from an option-based scheme to a pro-style, spread attack. During a one late-season three-game stretch, Tech faced teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks. Tech's offensive front allowed just five total sacks in those three games, including none against eventual ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia. In all, the Jackets didn't surrender a sack in two of its final four contests.

Key came back to his alma mater after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title.

In each of his three seasons at Alabama, Key's offensive lines were finalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top offensive front, and was the only group in the nation to receive the honor all three seasons. He also coached four All-Americans (including two unanimous picks – tackle Cam Robinson in 2016 and tackle Jonah Williams in 2018) and nine all-SEC selections (including seven first-teamers) during his time with the Tide. In addition to being unanimous All-Americans, Robinson won the 2016 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman and Williams was a finalist for the award in '18. They also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy (SEC's top offensive lineman) in '16 and '18, respectively.

Seven linemen that Key coached in his three seasons at Alabama went on to be selected in the National Football League Draft — Jedrick Wills (No. 10 overall, Cleveland Browns, 2020), Williams (No. 11 overall, Cincinnati Bengals, 2019), Alex Leatherwood (No. 17 overall, Las Vegas Raiders, 2021), Robinson (No. 34 overall, Jacksonville Jaguars, 2017), Ross Pierschbacher (fifth round, Washington Redskins, 2019), Bradley Bozeman (sixth round, Baltimore Ravens, 2018) and Deonte Brown (sixth round, Carolina Panthers, 2021).

Key was also lauded for his work on the recruiting trail at Alabama. He was tabbed as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports for his work in landing the Crimson Tide's 2019 class and the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for his efforts with the 2020 class.

Prior to his three-year stint at Alabama, Key spent 11 seasons at UCF (2005-15). He started at UCF as a graduate assistant and worked his way up to assistant head coach (2012-15) and offensive coordinator (2014-15). He also coached tight ends for three seasons (2006-08), offensive line for six seasons (2009-14), running backs for one season (2015), was special teams coordinator for one season (2008) and recruiting coordinator for six seasons (2007, 2010-14) with the Knights. In 2012, 2013 and 2014, Key was nominated for the Broyles Award, given to the top assistant coach in college football.

During Key's 11 seasons at UCF, the Knights won four conference championships (2007, 2010, 2013 and 2014), highlighted by a 12-1 campaign in 2013, which culminated with a 52-42 win over No. 6 Baylor. The Knights beat two top-10 teams in '13 (Baylor and No. 8 Louisville) and Key's offensive front, which did not allow a sack against Penn State, Louisville, UConn or Baylor, helped pave the way for UCF to average 441.5 yards and 34.6 points per game, both among the highest marks in program history. His offensive line also provided protection for American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year Blake Bortles.

In his six seasons as UCF's offensive line coach, eight different linemen earned all-conference recognition a total of 16 times and four went on to play in the NFL, including 2011 third-round draft pick Jah Reid. He also coached an NFL draft pick at tight end in Mike Merritt (2008).

During his time at UCF, Key coached under his head coach as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, George O'Leary.

Key got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech in 2001-02 and served as tight ends and running backs coach at Western Carolina in 2004.

Key was a four-year starter in his four seasons as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech (1997-2000). While making 44-straight starts at right guard, Key was a part of a senior class that led Georgia Tech to four-straight bowl appearances for the first time since 1953-56. As a sophomore in 1998, he helped lead Tech to a 10-2 record and a share of the ACC championship. During his junior campaign in 1999, the Jackets ranked No. 1 nationally in total offense (509.0 ypg). He was voted a team captain and all-ACC as a senior in 2000. In all, he was a key cog in an offensive front that helped the Yellow Jackets lead the ACC in rushing three times.

A Clay, Ala. native, Key, 45, was an all-state performer at Hewitt-Trussville H.S. He and his wife, Danielle, have a daughter, Harper.

### NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN OVER S.C. STATE

• Behind 290 yards and four touchdowns passing from r-So. QB **Haynes King** and 114 yards rushing from r-So. RB **Jamal Haynes**, Georgia Tech scored points on eight of its 12 offensive possessions and cruised to a 48-13 victory over South Carolina State last Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Hyundai Field.

• King's four touchdown passes marked only the 17th time in school history that a Yellow Jacket has thrown four or more touchdown passes in a game and the first since Jordan Yates had four TD passes versus Kennesaw State on Sept. 11, 2021.

• Haynes, who moved to running back from wide receiver this fall, became Tech's first 100-yard rusher since Hassan Hall ran for 157 yards at No. 24 Pitt on Oct. 1 of last season.

• Jr. DL **Kyle Kennard** had an interception in the first quarter, then forced and recovered a fumble in the third quarter, becoming the first Yellow Jacket with an interception, forced fumble and fumble recovery in the same game since Bruce Jordan-Swilling at Virginia on Nov. 4, 2017.

• Kennard's interception, forced fumble and fumble recovery were all career firsts, as was his ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week award.

• Georgia Tech's 48 points were its most in a game since a 56-33 win against Duke on Nov. 28, 2020.

• Georgia Tech's 578 yards of offense were its most in a game since 602 yards at USF on Sept. 8, 2018.

• Georgia Tech outgained S.C. State, 578-291, marking the first time that Tech has outgained an opponent by 200 yards since a 41-0 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1, 2018 (543-146).

• The 35-point margin of victory was Georgia Tech's largest since a 66-31 victory over Louisville on Oct. 5, 2018.

• The win snapped Georgia Tech's nine-game losing streak against opponents from the state of South Carolina.

• Kickoff was delayed by severe weather for two hours and 21 minutes (1:02 pm until 3:23 p.m.).

• The win was the 750th in school history, making Georgia Tech the 21st school in NCAA Division I FBS history with 750 victories and the fourth ACC program to achieve the milestone (joining Clemson, Virginia Tech and Pitt).

### GEORGIA TECH-OLE MISS SERIES HISTORY

• Georgia Tech and Ole Miss are meeting for the sixth time in a series that dates back to 1946.

• Ole Miss leads the all-time series, 3-2.

• Despite both teams having been founding members of the Southeastern Conference in 1932 and competing in the SEC together from 1933 until Georgia Tech's departure from the league following the 1963 season, Saturday's meeting is only the third regular-season matchup between Tech and Ole Miss.

• Georgia Tech is making its first-ever visit to Ole Miss, as the previous two regular-season matchups were both at Tech (1946 and 2022).

• The Yellow Jackets and Rebels have also squared off in three bowl games — the 1953 Sugar Bowl (a 24-7 GT win that clinched the 1952 national championship for the Yellow Jackets), the 1971 Peach Bowl (a 41-18 Ole Miss win) and the 2013 Music City Bowl (a 25-17 Ole Miss win).

### TECH NOTES vs. RANKED OPPONENTS

• Head coach **Brent Key** became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when the Yellow Jackets knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1 of last season. Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher - L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee - 1972; Pepper Rodgers - L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame - 1974; Bill Curry - L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama - 1980; Mac McWhorter - W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford - 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins - L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson - 2019).

• Georgia Tech went 2-3 against ranked opponents in 2022, which marked the first time that the Yellow Jackets beat multiple nationally ranked teams in a season since 2014, when they had three wins over ranked foes.

• Georgia Tech went 2-1 on the road against ranked opponents last season. A win on Saturday at No. 17/19 Ole Miss would give the Yellow Jackets three wins in four road games against ranked opponents for the first time since 2005-06 (W at No. 16 Auburn - 2005, L at No. 4 Virginia Tech - 2005, W at No. 3 Miami (Fla.) - 2005, W at No. 11 Virginia Tech - 2006).

• Nine of Georgia Tech's 10 touchdowns this season have been scored by players in their first season as Yellow Jackets — RB **Trey Cooley** (4 - transfer from Louisville), TE **Brett Seither** (2 - transfer from Georgia), WR **Eric Singleton Jr.** (2 - true freshman), WR **Dominick Blaylock** (transfer from Georgia) and WR **Chase Lane** (transfer from Texas A&M).

• Despite the success throwing the ball, a dominant ground game remains imperative for the Jackets' success, as Tech has run for at least 200 yards in eight of its last 15 wins.

• Georgia Tech's 268 rushing yards last Saturday against South Carolina State were its most in a game since 2021 (270 - Oct. 23 at Virginia) and the Yellow Jackets' fifth-most in a game since the departure of head coach Paul Johnson and his patented spread option offense following the 2018 season.

• However, the most consistent mark of Georgia Tech's success on offense has been its ability to take care of the football. Since the beginning of 2020, Georgia Tech has had an average of just 1.1 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 1.9 turnovers per game in losses.

• Georgia Tech's offense is guided by first-year offensive coordinator **Buster Faulker**, who came to Tech after winning two national championships in three seasons as a quality control assistant at Georgia.

• Faulker boasts 18 years of experience on college football staffs, including 11 seasons as an offensive coordinator at Valdosta State (2008), Murray State (2010), Middle Tennessee (2011-15), Arkansas State (2016-18) and Southern Miss (2019).

• R-So. **Haynes King**, a graduate transfer from Texas A&M, has been one of the nation's top quarterbacks in his first two games as a Yellow Jacket.

• Through two games at Georgia Tech, King has completed 40-of-61 (65.6 percent) passes for 603 yards (301.5 ypg) and a whopping seven touchdowns.

• King leads the ACC in five statistical categories and ranks in the top 20 nationally in eight categories.

• King made a record-breaking debut in the White and Gold, throwing for 313 yards and three touchdowns on 19-of-32 passing in the season opener against Louisville (Sept. 1).

• King's 313 passing yards against Louisville:

- were the most ever in a Georgia Tech debut;
- marked the first 300-yard passing performance by a player in his GT debut;
- are tied for 23rd in Georgia Tech single-game history;
- marked the 29th 300-yard passing game by an individual in Tech history.

• King's three touchdown passes against Louisville were tied for 17th in Georgia Tech single-game history (now 1-18th) and were the most by a Yellow Jacket since Jeff Sims threw three TDs at Virginia on Oct. 23, 2021.

• King threw for 1,579 yards and 10 touchdowns over 10 games (seven starts) at Texas A&M from 2020-22, including 1,220 yards and seven touchdowns in six games (five starts) last season.

• King's top performances as an Aggie included throwing for 253 yards and two touchdowns in a narrow 24-20 loss at No. 1 Alabama and for 279 yards and against Florida last season.

• Georgia Tech has the luxury of having three quarterbacks that have started and won college football games, as King is backed up by r-Fr. **Zach Pyron** and r-Jr. **Zach Gibson**.

• Pyron and Gibson were among the four quarterbacks that saw playing time for the Yellow Jackets during an injury-ravaged 2022 campaign in Tech's QB room.

• Pyron amassed an impressive 692 yards of total offense (565 passing, 127 rushing) and five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) in just three games as a true freshman last season. He completed 49-of-82 passes, good for a team-best .598 completion percentage.

• In his collegiate debut at Florida State (Oct. 29), Pyron came off the bench to complete 18-of-28 passes for 198 yards without an interception and account for two touchdowns (one passing, one rushing).

• Pyron made his first-career start in his second-career game at Virginia Tech (Nov. 5) and accounted for 319 yards of offense (253 passing, 66 rushing) and two fourth-quarter touchdowns (one passing, one rushing) to lead the Yellow Jackets back from a 27-16 fourth-quarter deficit to a 28-27 win.

• Trailing 27-16 with less than 10 minutes to go at VT, Pyron engineered two-consecutive touchdown drives of 90 and 73 yards to give Georgia Tech a 28-27 lead. He capped the fourth-quarter scoring drives with a 56-yard touchdown pass with 9:02 to go and what proved to be the game-winning 9-yard touchdown run with 3:30 left on the clock.

• Pyron led Georgia Tech's offense to a season-high 463 yards in the win at VT.

• In recognition of his performance at Virginia Tech, Pyron was named the ACC co-Rookie of the Week, becoming the first Yellow Jacket since 2020 to earn the distinction.

• In his first three full halves of action last season, Pyron led Tech to three of its four-highest single-half yardage totals of the year against FBS competition — 240 in second half vs. Florida State (Oct. 29), 234 in first half vs. Virginia Tech (last Saturday) and 229 in second half vs. VT (the only other half that cracked Tech's top four against FBS opponents last season was its 231-yard output in the second half at UCF on Sept. 24).

• Gibson appeared in six games and made three starts for the Yellow Jackets last season, throwing for 589 yards and a touchdown.

• Gibson put together his best performance as a Yellow Jacket in Tech's 21-17 win at No. 13/11 North Carolina (Nov. 19), when he completed 13-of-18 passes for 174 yards.

• Gibson's .722 completion percentage at UNC was a team high in 2022. He is one of only six Georgia Tech QBs since 2000 to complete at least 72% of his passes in a game (min. 15 attempts).

• R-So. **Jamal Haynes**, who made the switch to running back from wide receiver during the offseason, continues to show his versatility as a runner and a pass-catcher, racking up 253 all-purpose yards through two games.

• Haynes turned in a career-best performance last Saturday against S.C. State, running for 113 yards on nine carries (12.6 avg.) and recording his first-career touchdown on a 4-yard run to open the scoring in the first quarter.



**OFFENSE**

- Haynes' 113-yard performance against S.C. State was the first 100-yard rushing game of his career (prev. high: 51 vs. Louisville, Sept. 1) and the first 100-yard rushing game by a Yellow Jacket since Hassan Hall ran for 157 yards at Pitt on Oct. 1, 2022.

- With 107 yards from scrimmage against Louisville (Sept. 1) and 115 last Saturday against S.C. State, Haynes now owns two of Georgia Tech's four highest yards from scrimmage totals since the beginning of the 2022 season, behind only Hall's 161 combined rushing/receiving yards at Pitt on Oct. 1 of last season and current teammate **Trey Cooley's** 154 yards from scrimmage against S.C. State.

- Cooley, a junior transfer from Louisville, has also made an instant impact this season, amassing 206 all-purpose yards (145 rush, 61 receiving) and four touchdowns (three rushing, one receiving) through his first two games as a Yellow Jacket.

- Last Saturday against S.C. State, Cooley had 10 carries for 93 yards and a rushing touchdown, while also catching two passes for 61 yards, including a 55-yard strike to the endzone in the third quarter.

- Cooley began his Georgia Tech career by rushing for 52 rushing yards and two touchdowns on just nine carries (5.8 avg.) against his former team, Louisville (Sept. 1).

- Cooley is the first Yellow Jacket to score four touchdowns in a two-game span since quarterbacks TaQuon Marshall and Tobias Oliver scored four touchdowns apiece over a two-game span in 2018 against Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville (Oct. 5).

- Cooley is the first Tech running back to score four touchdowns in a two-game span since 2016, when Dedrick Mills scored one against Clemson (Sept. 22) and three against Miami (Oct. 1).

- With his two touchdown runs against Louisville, Cooley became the first Georgia Tech running back with multiple TD runs in a single game against NCAA Division I FBS competition since current Detroit Lion Jahmyr Gibbs and current Yellow Jackets r-Sr. **Dontae Smith** ran for two apiece in a 56-33 win over Duke on Nov. 28, 2020.

- As part of a two-headed monster at running back for the Yellow Jackets last season with current Cleveland Brown Hassan Hall, Smith set career highs with 420 yards on 87 carries in 2022.

- Through two games this season, Smith has run for 50 yards on 12 carries (4.2 avg.)

- Smith's 1,209 career rushing yards rank 41st in Georgia Tech history. Last season, he became the 51st player in program history to reach 1,000 yards in his career.

- With 102 rushing yards and three touchdowns on just 11 carries in Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Western Carolina last season (Sept. 10), Smith was one of only seven NCAA Division I FBS players (and one of four running backs) to compile at least 100 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries or less in a game in 2022.

- A true freshman, Singleton has recorded five catches for 103 yards (20.6 avg.) and two touchdowns over the first two games of his collegiate career.

- Pro Football Focus* grades Singleton as the No. 48 receiver in the country (78.8 grade) and No. 7-ranked receiver in the ACC through two games.

- PFF has also praised Lane (71.0) and Rutherford (70.6) for their play through two games, ranking them No. 24 and No. 25, respectively, among ACC wideouts.

- Rutherford leads Georgia Tech in receptions (10) and receiving yards (145) through two games, while Lane ranks second on the team behind only Singleton with a 17.5-yards-per-reception average (min. 5 rec.).

**TIGHT ENDS**

- Georgia Tech's tight ends room is led by Sr. **Dylan Leonard**, who is in his fifth season with the Yellow Jackets.

- Leonard, a former walk-on, has caught 27 passes for 231 yards over 30 games and 21 starts as a Yellow Jacket.

- Leonard missed three games due to injury last season (the first two games of last season, plus a late-season game at Virginia Tech), but made eight starts and caught 11 passes for 90 yards (8.2 avg.) in his nine games of action.

- Leonard caught at least one pass in 5-of-7 games to close the 2022 season.

- Sr. **Luke Benson**, who played in 34-of-35 games over three seasons at Syracuse (2019-21), hauled in nine receptions for 85 yards (9.4 avg.) in his first season at Georgia Tech in 2022.

- Benson had a catch for 7 yards in in the season opener versus Louisville (Sept. 1).

- Like their wide receivers, the Yellow Jackets' tight ends room was also bolstered by the addition of a veteran transfer in r-Jr. **Brett Seither**, who saw action in 27 games at Georgia over the past four seasons (2019-22).

- In his Georgia Tech debut versus Louisville (Sept. 1), Seither caught a 2-yard touchdown pass. His touchdown reception was the first by a Yellow Jackets tight end since Dylan Deveney caught an 18-yard touchdown pass against Pitt on Dec. 10, 2020.

- Seither hauled in his second touchdown in as many receptions as a Yellow Jacket with an 8-yard TD catch last Saturday against S.C. State.

- Seither is the first Georgia Tech tight end with multiple touchdowns in a season since Jonh Paul Foschi caught two touchdown passes in 2003.

• While not quite on its gaudy pace from a season ago, the Yellow Jackets have forced three turnovers in two games this season (1.5 per game — good for fifth in the ACC).

• The Yellow Jackets rank in the top half of the ACC this season in takeaways, interceptions (2 - fourth) and fumble recoveries (1 - sixth).

• Last Saturday against South Carolina State, both of Georgia Tech's takeaways (an interception and a forced fumble/fumble recovery by Jr. DL **Kyle Kennard**) led directly to Tech touchdowns. The Jackets outscored the Bulldogs, 14-0, on points off turnovers.

• Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 2.8 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 1.0 takeaways per game in losses.

• Tech has ranked among the top 25 nationally in fumble recoveries each of the past three seasons — No. 2 nationally with 12 in 2020, tied for 16th with 10 in 2021 and tied for seventh with 13 in 2022.

**INDIVIDUAL**

• Jr. DL **Kyle Kennard** pulled off a rare trifecta last Saturday against South Carolina State, recording an interception, forced fumble and fumble recovery in the Yellow Jackets' 48-13 win.

• Both Kennard's interception in the first quarter and his forced/fumble in the third quarter led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.

• The interception, forced fumble and fumble recovery were all career firsts for Kennard, who was playing in his 32nd career game.

• Kennard is only the second Yellow Jacket since 2000 with an interception, forced fumble and fumble recovery in a game, joining Bruce Jordan-Swilling, who pulled off the trifecta at Virginia on Nov. 4, 2017.

• Kennard became the fourth Yellow Jacket in the last 10 games with an interception and a fumble recovery in the same game (joining Charlie Thomas — Oct. 1, 2022 vs. Pitt, LaMiles Brooks — Oct. 20, 2022 vs. Virginia and Clayton Powell-Lee vs. Virginia Tech — Nov. 5, 2022). However, only two other Yellow Jackets have accomplished the feat since 2000 (Quayshawn Nealy — Oct. 19, 2013 vs. Syracuse and Nov. 8, 2014 vs. NC State and Jordan-Swilling — Nov. 4, 2017 vs. Virginia).

• In recognition of his impressive achievement against S.C. State, Kennard was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the first time in his career.

• Through two games this season, Kennard leads Georgia Tech in tackles with 13. He also leads the team in fumble recoveries (1) and is tied for team lead in interceptions (1) and forced fumbles (1).

• Kennard's eight tackles in the season opener against Louisville (Sept. 1) shattered his previous career high of five, which he accomplished twice (last at Florida State - Oct. 29, 2022).

• Through two games this season, *Pro Football Focus* ranks Kennard as the top defensive end in the ACC with a gaudy 85.0 overall defensive grade, which also rank 19th nationally among defensive ends. (*Grades from 80-89 are considered all-conference level in PFF's grading scale*).

• PFF also rates Kennard with the sixth-best overall defender among all positions in the ACC.

• Through two games this season, PFF ranks So. DB **Clayton Powell-Lee** as the No. 12 overall defender in the ACC (min. 80 snaps) with a grade of 78.7.

• Powell-Lee's overall defensive rating from PFF is buoyed by his ACC-leading 88.3-grade pass coverage rating (No. 10 nationally).

• A freshman all-American last season, Powell-Lee picked up right where he left off in 2022 with five tackles, an interception and a pass breakup in the season opener versus Louisville (Sept. 1).

• Powell-Lee recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass in the same game when he did both in the fourth quarter of Georgia Tech's 28-27 come-from-behind win at Virginia Tech last season (Nov. 5).

• Like his current teammates Kennard and Powell-Lee, Jr. DB **LaMiles Brooks** has also recorded an interception and fumble recovery in the same game, with Brooks having done so last season against Virginia (Oct. 20). Brooks notched his first-career fumble recovery, then returned the second interception of his career 37 yards for a touchdown, all in the first quarter against UVA.

• At the time, Brooks was the only NCAA Division I FBS player with as many as nine tackles, a fumble recovery and an interception return for a touchdown in a single game in 2022, although the feat was matched two days later by Duke's Brandon Johnson and again later in the season by Memphis' Xavier Cullens. However, Brooks remains one of only five ACC players and 15 FBS players since 2000 to accomplish the feat.

• PFF particularly lauded Brooks for his pass coverage skill, which was graded at 88.5 in 2022, good for 14th nationally and second in the ACC among safeties.

• In all, Georgia Tech returned six defensive players that played at least 125 snaps last season with above average overall defensive grades from *Pro Football Focus* — Brooks (83.9), DL **D'Quan Douse** (78.3), DL **Sylvain Yondjouen** (71.4), DB **Myles Sims** (69.3), Powell-Lee (68.9), and DB **Kenan Johnson** (68.7).

• A fifth-year senior from Ruisbroek, Belgium, Yondjouen entered this season as one of the oldest players in college football at 25 years of age.

• Born on June 21, 1998, Yondjouen is the fourth-oldest player in the ACC, the third-oldest defensive lineman in the nation (behind USC's Tyrone Teleni - 27 and Baylor's David Marshall - 25) and the 28th-oldest player in NCAA Division I FBS.

• Yondjouen sustained a season-ending knee injury in Georgia Tech's season opener against Louisville (Sept. 1). He plans to medically redshirt and return to Georgia Tech for a sixth season in 2024.

## DEFENSE

- Helping reload the linebacker position for Georgia Tech in 2023, Jr. **Trenilyas Tatum** is tied for third on the team this season with 10 tackles, including a game-high-tying eight in the season opener against Louisville (Sept. 1).
- *Pro Football Focus* rated Tatum as the fourth-best linebacker in the ACC and No. 14 overall defender in the conference with a 79.0 defensive grade in Week 1.
- R-Jr. DB **K.J. Wallace**, who is tied for the ACC lead this season with three passes defended (all breakups), also ranks as the No. 9 overall defender in the ACC, according to PFF (78.9 grade).
- PFF rates Wallace as an 80-plus defender in both tackling (81.6) and pass coverage (81.1).
- r-Sr. DB **Jaylon King** set a career high with a game-high-tying eight tackles in the season opener against Louisville (Sept. 1) and ranks second on the team for the season with 11 tackles.
- King's eight tackles against Louisville matched his career high, which he originally set last season at UCF (Sept. 24).

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

- A place where Georgia Tech has found a significant advantage through two games this season is in the punt game.
- The Yellow Jackets are averaging 12.0 yards per punt return, good for second in the ACC and 29th nationally.
- Tech's national punt return ranking continues to rise after ranking last in the ACC and 121st nationally in punt returns in 2021. Last season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 39th nationally in punt return average (9.33 avg.).
- When punting, the Jackets are allowing an average of 3.0 yards per return, good for a net average of plus-9.0 yards per game in the punt game.
- Individually, r-Jr. **Dominick Blaylock** leads the ACC and ranks 18th nationally in punt return average at 11.0 yards per return.
- Jr. P **David Shanahan**, is averaging 43.0 yards per punt with three of his four kicks being downed inside the 20 yard line.
- With only four kicks, Shanahan does not qualify for the official NCAA or ACC statistical rankings. Shanahan's low number of attempts can be attributed to Georgia Tech not punting in last Saturday's 48-13 win over South Carolina State, which marked the first time that the Yellow Jackets have not punted in a game since a 66-31 win at Louisville on Oct. 5, 2018.

- On kickoffs, Georgia Tech has also forced its opponents into undesirable field position due to the strength of its kicker's leg, as Jr. PK **Gavin Stewart** has put 13 of his 14 kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks this season.

- Georgia Tech finished tied for 10th nationally and ranked second in the ACC with four blocked kicks last season.

- Since becoming Georgia Tech's primary kickoff specialist in 2021, Stewart has forced touchbacks 71 of his 106 kickoffs (.670). Of his other 35 kickoffs, nine have been fair-caught and only 26 have been returned.

- Stewart has gotten off to an uncharacteristically slow start this season by missing each of his first three field goal attempts of the season (from 54 and 33 yards vs. Louisville on Sept. 1 and 44 yards vs. S.C. State last Saturday).

- Stewart was not alone in sustaining unusual struggles as a place kicker in Week 1 of this season. Stewart, Arkansas State's Dominic Zvada, South Alabama's Diego Guajardo and TCU's Griffin Kell each missed only one field goal last season. They combined to miss six in Week 1 (two each for Stewart and Zvada, one apiece by Guajardo and Kell). In all, FBS kickers have made 70% of field goals through Week 1 of this season after making 75% of their attempts through Week 1 last season.

- Last season, Stewart made 12-for-13 field goal attempts, good for 12th nationally and second in the ACC (.923).

- Stewart became the first Georgia Tech kicker in the past 40 seasons (since at least 1982) to make his first 10 field goal attempts of a campaign.

- He stretched the string of consecutive field goals made to 12 before an errant snap and hold led to his first miss of the season in the next-to-last game of the season at North Carolina (Nov. 19).

- Stewart scored 43 of Georgia Tech's 147 points over the final eight games of the 2022 campaign.

- In the first extensive action of his career as a place kicker, Stewart was named ACC Specialist of the Week following his 4-for-4 performance in Tech's 26-21 win at No. 24 Pitt (Oct. 1).

- Stewart's four field goals made against Pitt were the most in a game by a Georgia Tech kicker since Wesley Wells made four, including the overtime game-winner, in a 30-27 win over Virginia on Nov. 17, 2018, and the most by a Yellow Jacket in a regulation game since current Kansas City Chiefs PK Harrison Butker made four in Tech's 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016).

- Stewart is one of only nine players in Georgia Tech history to make as many as four field goals in a game.

- Last Saturday versus South Carolina State, highly touted r-Fr. PK **Aidan Birr** made his collegiate debut and went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts from 30 and 42 yards.

- Georgia Tech lived up to its reputation as one of the most effective kick-blocking units in the nation when it blocked its first kick of the season last Saturday versus South Carolina State, an extra point.

- Tech has blocked nine kicks in the last 43 games.

- Prior to blocking nine kicks in the past 43 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between block kicks.

- Since the beginning of the 2013 season, Georgia Tech has blocked 28 kicks, which is tied for the third-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• Georgia Tech is one of the nation's most disciplined teams through two games, with just five penalties for 65 yards. The Yellow Jackets rank third nationally (first in the ACC) in fewest penalties per game (2.5) and 20th nationally (fourth in the ACC) in fewest penalty yards per game (32.5).

• Last Saturday's win over South Carolina State was the 750th win in Georgia Tech football history.

• Georgia Tech outgained S.C. State 578-291, marking the first time that Tech has outgained an opponent by 200 yards since a 41-0 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1, 2018 (543-146).

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses over the last three-plus seasons. In their 12 wins since the beginning of the 2020 campaign, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in nine of 12 games and are plus-20 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in 15 of its 24 defeats since the beginning of 2020 and is minus-21 overall in turnover margin in those 24 losses.

• Head coach **Brent Key** is the fifth Georgia Tech alumnus to ever serve as the Yellow Jackets' football head coach, joining William Alexander (1920-44), Bill Fulcher (1972-73), Pepper Rodgers (1974-79) and Bill Curry (1980-86).

• Of the 12 men that have served as Georgia Tech's head coach for more than one game since Bobby Dodd took the reins in 1945, Key is one of only four that won his first two games at the helm of the Jackets, joining Bud Carson (1967), Chan Gailey (2002) and Paul Johnson (2009).

• Key became the second coach in Georgia Tech history to ever defeat a ranked opponent in his first game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach when Tech knocked off No. 24 Pitt, 26-21, on Oct. 1 of last season.

• Tech head coaches were previously 1-4 when facing nationally ranked teams in their GT debuts (Bill Fulcher – L, 34-3 vs. No. 15 Tennessee – 1972; Pepper Rodgers – L, 31-7 vs. No. 2 Notre Dame – 1974; Bill Curry – L, 26-3 vs. No. 2 Alabama – 1980; Mac McWhorter – W, 24-14 vs. No. 11 Stanford – 2001 Seattle Bowl; Geoff Collins – L, 52-14 vs. No. 1 Clemson – 2019).

• Georgia Tech's 2023 full-time coaches and analysts have combined to win 105 championships at high school (state), college (division/conference/national) and NFL (division/conference/Super Bowl) levels as players and coaches.
