WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Saturday will be the sixth all-time meeting between Ole Miss and Georgia Tech ... The Rebels lead all-time, 3-2.
- This marks Georgia Tech's first ever trip to Oxford ... 3-of-5 series contests have been bowl games.
- Ole Miss has won the last three meetings in the series, including a 42-0 shutout win in Atlanta last season.
- Last season's shutout is still the largest win for Ole Miss against a non-SEC Power-5 school since 1950 (45-0, Boston College), and was its first shutout against a non-SEC Power-5 school since 1961 (33-0, Florida State).
- Ole Miss is 13-7-1 against the current members of the ACC.
- Ole Miss is 104-35-3 (.743) in September home games (including contests played in Memphis and Jackson).
- Ole Miss is 116-41-6 (.730) all-time versus non-conference opponents during September.
- QB **Jaxson Dart** leads the SEC in yards/attempt at 12.02 (No. 2 FBS), pass efficiency at 206.6 (No. 3 FBS) and yards/comp. at 17.2 (No. 5 FBS) ... Against Mercer, he became the sixth Ole Miss QB with 11 straight completions.
- Ole Miss has two non-offensive TDs this season: a 70-yard punt return vs. Mercer (WR **Jordan Watkins**) and a 26-yard fumble return on a sack fumble at Tulane (DE **Jared Ivey**).
- Ole Miss is averaging 49.5 seconds per opening scoring drive this season ... Fastest of 48 seconds (at Tulane).
- WR **Tre Harris** broke the Ole Miss record with four receiving TD against Mercer, becoming just the 22nd player in SEC history to catch at least four in a game.
- The Rebel defense has at least 4.0 sacks and 6.0 TFL in each game this season.
- Of the 126 total players on the roster, 58 (46%) are brand-new for 2023 ... 31 (24.6%) are transfers.
- DE **Cedric Johnson** was awarded the Chucky Mullins Courage Award and will wear a No. 38 patch this season.

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT, beginning with head football coach Lane Kiffin. The press conference is streamed live on SEC Network+ (ESPN App). Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (noon). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE: Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference teleconference every Wednesday at noon, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season. The number is available through the SEC office at 205-458-3000.

PRACTICES: Practice footage is available periodically on the Ole Miss FTP site. At open practices, video is permitted for stretch only, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Photographers must use tight shots and no formations.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 2) daily newspapers; 3) network affiliate television stations; 4) magazines, non-broadcast radio stations and weekly newspapers.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested during credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos. Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO RIGHTS: The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by Learfield in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. Broadcast lines should be ordered through AT&T (1-877-438-0041). Visiting networks may also wish to contact Cabell Philpott with Learfield (336-831-0719 or cabell.philpott@imgworld.com), concerning the SEC's network agreement.

RADIO/TELEVISION SHOW: The RebTalk radio show gives fans the opportunity to ask Coach Kiffin questions concerning Ole Miss Football. The talk show, hosted by David Kellum, will air every Thursday during the season at 6 p.m. "The Season: Ole Miss Football" is an award-winning, weekly 30-minute show produced by Ole Miss Sports Productions. It debuts Wednesdays at 6 p.m. CT on TheSeasonOleMiss.com and airs on ESPN.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST GEORGIA TECH

Sept. 17, 2022 • Atlanta, Ga. • #17 Ole Miss 42, Georgia Tech 0

The Rebels rushed for 316 yards on the day and six total rushing touchdowns in a 42-0 shutout win over Georgia Tech. The Rebel defense also played a major role in the team's win over the Yellow Jackets, pitching their first full-game shutout since 2014. The Ole Miss defense stonewalled Georgia Tech, allowing just 214 total yards along with seven total sacks.

Dec. 30, 2013 • Nashville, Tenn. • Ole Miss 25, Georgia Tech 17

Bo Wallace threw one touchdown and ran for two more, and the Rebel defense held the Georgia Tech triple-option attack in check en route to a 25-17 victory in the 2013 Music City Bowl. Wallace, who was named the game's MVP, finished the game 22-32 for 256 yards. Defensively, the Rebels held the Yellow Jackets to just seven points in the first three quarters of play and allowed less than 300 total yards in the victory.

Dec. 30, 1971 • Atlanta, Ga. • #17 Ole Miss 41, Georgia Tech 18

In a soggy night game in Georgia Tech's backyard, Ole Miss walloped the Yellow Jackets 41-18 for a Peach Bowl victory. Ole Miss scored five touchdowns and forced five Tech turnovers. Quarterback Norris Weese received the Most Valuable Offensive Player trophy after passing for 116 yards and a touchdown and rushing for 32 yards and another score.

Oct. 12, 1946 • Atlanta, Ga. • Georgia Tech 24, Ole Miss 7

Georgia Tech's defense held Ole Miss to just 62 total yards, and the Rebels lost on the road 24-7. The lone Ole Miss score came on a 25-yard pass play from Bobby Wilson to "Hairline" Harper.

Jan. 1, 1953 • New Orleans, La. • #2 Georgia Tech 24, #7 Ole Miss 7

In a battle of two of the nation's top teams, Georgia Tech prevailed 24-7 in the 1953 Sugar Bowl. The Rebels were plagued by six turnovers. Ole Miss scored first on a Wissy Dillard 4-yard run, but the Rebels could not hold off Tech the rest of the way. It was the first of eight Sugar Bowl appearances for Ole Miss from 1953-70.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin is in his fourth season at Ole Miss, where he has led the Rebels to three consecutive bowl berths to start off his time in Oxford. In 11 years at the NCAA level, Kiffin has posted an all-time record of 86-47, including a 25-13 mark at Ole Miss. The Rebels ranked No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4) last season. Kiffin helped mentor and recruit talented true freshman running back Quinshon Judkins, who set the Ole Miss single-season records in both rushing yards (1,567) and rushing touchdowns (16). Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, its highest final ranking since 2016. Ole Miss ranked top-20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories in his first season in 2020. In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

GEORGIA TECH HEAD COACH BRENT KEY

Brent Key, a Georgia Tech alumnus, is in his first full year with the Yellow Jackets after taking over the reins of the program midway through last year. Key helped lead Georgia Tech to a 4-4 record over the final eight games of the 2022 season as interim head coach. The four wins included two road victories over nationally ranked opponents. The Jackets overcame a plethora of injuries in 2022 to finish 5-7 overall and 4-4 in ACC play after a 1-3 (0-1 ACC) start. Prior to being named interim head coach on Sept. 26, 2022, Key served as the Yellow Jackets' assistant head coach/offensive line coach/run game coordinator for three-plus seasons. Key returned to Georgia Tech in 2019 after three seasons as offensive line coach at Alabama (2016-18), where he helped lead the Crimson Tide to two Southeastern Conference championships, three College Football Playoff championship games and the 2017 national title. His coaching resume also includes a successful 11-year stint at UCF, where he helped lead the Knights to four conference championships and eight bowl appearances, one season as an assistant coach at Western Carolina and two seasons as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech. Key was a four-year starter at guard for the Yellow Jackets from 1997-2000. He was a team captain and all-ACC performer as a senior and graduated from Tech in 2001 with a management degree.

YELLOW JACKETS SCOUTING REPORT

Georgia Tech heads to Oxford 1-1 on the season and is coming off a 48-13 home win over South Carolina State. Offensively, the Yellow Jackets rank No. 9 nationally in total offense, averaging 533 yards per game through the first two contests of the 2023 season. Texas A&M transfer Haynes King leads the ACC with 301.5 passing yards per game and seven passing TDs. Five different Yellow Jacket receivers have hauled in at least one receiving TD this season, including Eric Singleton, Jr. and Brett Seither who both have two receiving touchdowns on the season. Running backs Jamal Haynes and Trey Cooley have shared the workload on the ground, combining for 310 rushing yards and four TDs through the first two games of the season. Defensively, Georgia Tech is giving up 382.5 yards per game, including 211.5 yards per game on the ground. Defensive end Kyle Kennard leads the Yellow Jackets with 13 total tackles, one interception and one forced fumble this season.

GEORGIA TECH SERIES HISTORY

- Ole Miss and Georgia Tech are meeting for the sixth time, with the Rebels holding a 3-2 lead.
- Three of the five prior contests between the Rebels and Yellow Jackets have been in bowl games.
- Georgia Tech won the lone non-neutral game between the two teams in 1946, 24-7 (Grant Field).
- Ole Miss has won the last three meetings in the series, including a 42-0 Rebel win in Atlanta in 2022.
- This game marks Georgia Tech's first ever trip to Oxford.

SHOUTOUT FOR SHUTOUTS

Last season in Atlanta, the Rebel defense pitched a 42-0 shutout victory over the Yellow Jackets, still the largest Power-5 victory for Ole Miss since beating Mississippi State, 45-0, in 2008, and the largest non-SEC Power-5 win since defeating Boston College, 54-0, in 1950 in Oxford. It was the first shutout for the Rebels since beating Presbyterian, 48-0, in 2014, the first on the road for Ole Miss since a 39-0 victory at Tulane in 2012, and the first against a non-current member of the SEC since beating Florida State 33-0 in 1961. Ole Miss also had two shutouts against current SEC members before they entered the conference against Missouri in 1974 (10-0) and South Carolina in 1972 (21-0).

- 547 yards of offense, the most against a non-SEC Power-5 opponent since recording 569 against Louisville in 2021.

BIG BOOT

Senior transfer kicker **Caden Davis** had only hit one career field goal in three seasons at Texas A&M, but in two games with the Rebels, not only does Davis already have four in four tries, but he also has the fourth-longest boot in school history. Davis played a crucial role in Ole Miss' comeback victory over No. 22 Tulane, going 3-of-3 on his field goal tries, but none bigger than his fourth quarter 56-yard behemoth that sailed through the uprights to give the Rebels a 10-point lead after being down 10 in the first half. That 56-yard shot by Davis soared past his previous of 40 yards in his only made field goal of his Texas A&M career in four total attempts. It leads the SEC and stands tied for second-longest in the FBS this season, and it ranks No. 4 in Ole Miss history -- the best since Bryan Owen nailed a 57-yarder against Tulane in 1988.

CAUSING MAYHEM

Ole Miss has notched at least 4.0 sacks and 6.0 tackles for loss in each of its first two games, and have done so with a wide range of defenders getting in on the action. Eight Rebels have contributed to a quarterback sack, while 13 have chipped in on a TFL. And all that mayhem is paying off, with two forced fumbles (including a **Khari Coleman** sack fumble returned for a TD by **Jared Ivey** vs. Tulane), two interceptions, nine QB hurries, 11 pass breakups and 27 points off turnovers through two games played. In the Kiffin era, Ole Miss has recorded multiple sacks in 26 games, at least 5.0 tackles for loss in 25 games, and at least 4.0 sacks in 15 games. In games with at least 5.0 tackles for loss, Ole Miss is 17-8, and in games with at least 4.0 sacks, the Rebels are 8-2. This season, Ole Miss ranks third in the SEC in both sacks and TFL, and on the FBS lists ranks ninth and 14th, respectively.

PRINCE OF THE PICK

Senior CB **Deantre Prince** nabbed his sixth career interception at a pivotal juncture of Ole Miss' ranked victory at Tulane on Sept. 9, adding to his total as the Rebels' active career leader in picks. Prince has been the top cover corner for the Rebels so far this season at a 79.7 grade from PFF, with opposing quarterbacks only looking his direction 11 times in 60 coverage snaps and Prince only yielding 23 yards receiving on his island. The preseason All-SEC selection and Senior Bowl watch list member only allowed 22 receptions in 434 coverage snaps last season, and had 12 games with 50 receiving yards or fewer allowed.

WE WANNA GO FAST!

The Rebels ended the 2022 regular season tied for the FBS lead at 20.7 seconds per play, and Ole Miss has showed no signs of slowing down in the opening stages of 2023. Ole Miss is currently clipping off a play every 21.9 seconds, and it has been no more on display than the opening drives of each of its first two games. Ole Miss is averaging 49.5 seconds per opening drive this season after opening against Mercer with a 51-second drive that ended with the first of three touchdown passes from QB **Jaxson Dart** to WR **Tre Harris** in the first quarter alone. At No. 22 Tulane, the Rebels were at it again, scoring in just 48 seconds that ended with a 31-yard strike from Dart to Harris. The 51-second drive against Mercer was the fastest to open a season for Ole Miss since 2018, and the 28 first quarter points ranks as the most in available records since at least 1967. The 48-second debut against the Green Wave, meanwhile, was the fastest on any opening drive for the Rebels since finding the endzone in just 34 seconds against Liberty on Nov. 6, 2021. In the Kiffin era, Ole Miss is 21-5 when scoring first.

BACK TO WORK

The praise and accolades have come hard and heavy for sophomore RB **Quinshon Judkins** following his spectacular freshman campaign in 2022, but Judkins has set back to the grindstone with two solid outings to open the 2023 season. On the year, Judkins has 108 yards and three touchdowns rushing, including two scores against Mercer in the opener that registered as his seventh career multi-TD game after breaking the single-season Ole Miss record with six such games as a freshman last season. Judkins is already climbing up several career lists, currently ranking tied for 10th in career rushing touchdowns (19), 13th in career rushing yards (1,675) and sixth in career 100-yard rushing games (8). Combined with his one receiving touchdown from last season, he's also starting to knock on the door of Ole Miss' all-purpose touchdown list with 20 total.

THROWIN' DARTS

Junior QB **Jaxson Dart** has been one of the top signal callers nationally through two weeks of action, currently leading the SEC in yards per attempt at 12.0 (No. 2 FBS), passing efficiency at 206.6 (No. 3 FBS) and yards per completion at 17.2 (No. 5 FBS), while also ranking within the SEC top-five in passing touchdowns with six (FBS No. 9), passing yards per game at 300.5 (FBS No. 13) and total offense at 339.0 ypg (FBS No. 11). Dart has been especially effective in the first quarters of both games so far this season, standing at 18-of-19 for 246 yards and four touchdowns in the opening frame. That includes a blistering 11-for-11 stretch to open the season against Mercer, making him just the seventh Ole Miss quarterback to ever throw 11 consecutive completions and the best such streak since Matt Corral set the school record at 19 in a row at Vanderbilt in 2020. Dart most recently moved into 14th all-time at Ole Miss in passing yards with 3,575 and 12th in total offense at 4,266. In his overall career combining totals from his freshman season at USC in 2021, Dart owns 4,928 and 5,662 yards in both categories, respectively.

QUADRUPLE THREAT

Louisiana native **Tre Harris** has had a nose for the endzone in just two games as a Rebel, highlighted by the game of his life against Mercer on Sept. 2. Against the Bears, Harris wowed the Vaught-Hemingway faithful by finding the endzone on each of his first three catches as a Rebel, which tied the school record and helped the lightning-quick Ole Miss offense get up early in its eventually 73-7 blowout win. Harris tacked on a fourth touchdown reception in the fourth quarter, in the process breaking the school record and becoming just the 22nd player in SEC history to haul in at least four touchdown receptions in a single game. Harris ended the day as Ole Miss' top receiver, nabbing six catches for 133 yards and his record-breaking four trips to the endzone. Harris is no stranger to the multi-TD effort, having caught three touchdown passes against Rice last October while a member of the Louisiana Tech football team. Harris -- a preseason Biletnikoff Award watch list member -- owns a career line of 114 receptions, 1,705 yards and 19 touchdowns -- 15 of which have come within the last calendar year after a 10 TD season with the Bulldogs in 2022. In 2023, Harris is still the only receiver in the FBS with four touchdown receptions in a single game, and combined with his fifth TD early in the game at No. 22 Tulane, he ranks second in both the FBS and SEC.

NO FRESHMAN JITTERS

Freshman LB **Suntarine Perkins** was a highly-touted recruit nationally as the No. 1 overall player in Mississippi and the No. 2 linebacker in the country, and he relished his first opportunity to wear a Rebel uniform in his home state against Mercer on Sept. 2. Perkins led all Rebels with nine tackles coming off the bench, including four solo, in Ole Miss' 73-7 rout of the Bears. At Raleigh High School, Perkins was a one-man wrecking crew, leading RHS to its first state title in 2022 as both its star running back and linebacker. In the state title game, Perkins ran 32 times for 331 yards and four touchdowns while also contributing six tackles and an interception on the other side of the ball. In his high school career, Perkins totaled more than 5,000 all-purpose yards, including 2,078 rushing yards and 32 touchdowns on the ground as a senior. As a linebacker, he tallied 267 total tackles and 10 sacks in his high school career.

HISTORIC BLOWOUT

Ole Miss kicked off 2023 with a bombastic offensive onslaught against Mercer on Sept. 2, winning by a final margin of 73-7:

- 73 points: tied for No. 7 in school history, No. 18 in SEC history
- 73 points: leads the SEC, ranks No. 3 in the FBS this season.
- 73 points: most of the Kiffin era, most for Ole Miss since 2018 (76, Southern Illinois).
- 667 yards of total offense: No. 6 in school history
- 667 yards of total offense: leads the SEC, tied for No. 8 in the FBS this season.
- 21st game of Kiffin era with at least 600 yards of total offense (only 16 ever at Ole Miss prior to 2020)

HIGH-FLYING OFFENSE

On the field, the Rebel offense ranks among the most prolific in the nation, ranking second in yards per game since 2020 (511.5 ypg/38 games) and third in total yards since 2020 (19,438 yards). The Rebels have done it with a balanced attack over the last three years as well, as Ole Miss ranks alongside only Ohio State as the only two Power-5 teams with both a top-10 passing season (2020; No. 7) and a top-10 rushing season (2022; No. 3) since 2020.

RACKING UP THE YARDS

Kiffin's dynamic Ole Miss offenses have single-handedly dismantled the Rebel record books, recording three of the top-five offensive seasons in school history since 2020. Leading the way is the 2020 squad that ended the season ranked No. 3 in total offense nationally at an Ole Miss record 555.5 yards per game (5,555 yards). His 2021 team ranks fifth at 492.5 yards per game (6,402 yards), and last year the Rebels broke into the top-five again, this time notching the fourth-best season ever at 496.4 yards per game (6,453 yards). Impressively, Kiffin's Ole Miss teams have done so with a balanced offensive attack, ranking seventh in the FBS in passing in 2020 (344.9 ypg) before shifting toward the running game in 2021 with the No. 12 ground game (217.6 ypg) before 2022's single-season school record rushing attack of 3,336 yards (256.6) led the SEC and ranked No. 3 in the FBS behind only the service academies.

With those big single-season numbers come monster single-game numbers as well. Kiffin owns 21 games during his Ole Miss tenure with at least 600 yards of total offense, as opposed to just 16 times total from the beginning of the Ole Miss football program in 1893 until Kiffin's arrival in 2020. At the 700-yard plateau, Kiffin's Rebels own three of the five total 700-yard games in Ole Miss history, as well as four of the top-six performances all-time.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

The Rebel opened the season with a stifling performance against Mercer before several clutch moments at Tulane that helped Ole Miss toward a ranked victory over the Green Wave.

- Ole Miss has returned its two interceptions this season for 63 yards, currently No. 3 in the SEC and No. 12 in the FBS.
- Five different Rebels have had their hand in Ole Miss' three forced fumbles either on the force or recovery ... Six Rebels have batted down a pass, and seven have recorded at least one QB hurry.
- S **Trey Washington**, LB **Ashanti Cistrunk** and LB **Khari Coleman** all lead Ole Miss with 10 total tackles on the year.
- At Tulane, Cistrunk played in his 50th career game, which was also his 50th consecutive game played, all at Ole Miss ... Also hitting 50 career games played at Tulane include transfer defensive backs **Zamari Walton** and **Teja Young**.
- DE **Cedric Johnson** recorded career sack No. 14.5 against Mercer ... Johnson is Ole Miss' active career sacks leader.
- S **Daijahn Anthony** has three passes defended so far, including an interception against Mercer.
- DE **Isaac Ukwu** tallied his first tackles for Ole Miss against Tulane, ending with six tackles (four solo), 2.0 TFL, one sack and two QB hurries ... Ukwu now has 17.5 sacks in his college career.

CEDRIC JOHNSON RECEIVES CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD

Ole Miss DE **Cedric Johnson** was recently named the winner of the 2023 Chucky Mullins Courage Award. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. A native of Mobile, Alabama, Johnson is the 33rd recipient in the 34-year history of the award. He will wear a No. 38 patch throughout the 2023 season. Johnson — a Bednarik Award and Senior Bowl watch list member who has also been named to preseason All-SEC teams by Phil Steele (first team), Athlon (third team) and Lindy's (third team) — entered 2023 as Ole Miss' active career leader in sacks with 13.5. Last season, Johnson played in 11 games for the Rebels, starting in eight at defensive end. He finished the season with 32 total tackles, 4.0 sacks and 4.5 tackles for loss. He also blocked a punt against Georgia Tech, becoming the first Rebel since 2012 to block a punt and record a sack in the same game.

NEW FACES

Roster turnover is the name of the game in modern college athletics, which means Ole Miss is no stranger to new faces. This season, out of 126 total student-athletes on the roster, 58 (46.0%) are brand-new to the Rebel squad. Of those, 31 (24.6%) are new transfers this past spring and summer, and 27 (21.4%) are freshmen signees. Combined with transfers from previous seasons, a total of 51 Rebels (40.5%) have transferred to Ole Miss on the current 2023 roster.

PORTAL COMBAT

For the second straight year, Ole Miss ended up within the top-six of the 247Sports transfer rankings, sitting at No. 3 in the 2023 cycle. A total of 14 Rebel transfers helped contribute to the ranking, including four within 247's top-100 transfers: QB **Walker Howard** (No. 42), TE **Caden Prieskorn** (No. 47), CB **John Saunders Jr.** (No. 86) and LB **Monty Montgomery** (No. 94). Other notable Rebel transfers contributing to the No. 3 ranking are: OL **Victor Curne**, WR **Zakhari Franklin**, CB **DeShawn Gaddie Jr.**, DT **Joshua Harris**, WR **Tre Harris**, LB **Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste**, QB **Spencer Sanders**, DE **Isaac Ukwu**, CB **Zamari Walton** and S **Teja Young**.

RETURNING STRENGTH

However, Ole Miss does have a strong supply of returning talent for 2023. On the offensive side of the ball, the Rebels return 66.1 percent of all their total snaps from 2022, in addition to 70.3 percent of their rushing attack and 95.8 percent of their passing game. On the offensive line, Ole Miss returns a formidable veteran group that was on the field of 77.8 percent of all offensive line snaps last season. Where the percentages dip below 60 percent are where Ole Miss has gone out and found reinforcements. Ole Miss returns only 35.9 percent of its receiving output from last year following the departure of key receivers Jonathan Mingo and Malik Heath to the NFL, who combined for 111 catches for 1,832 yards and 10 touchdowns last season. But Ole Miss brought in five new receivers, highlighted by Biletnikoff Award watch list members **Zakhari Franklin** and **Tre Harris**, as well as freshmen **Ayden Williams** and **Cayden Lee**. Ole Miss returns some solid production in the pass rush game on the defensive side of the ball, but went looking hard for replacements across the board. Of the 58 total newcomers on Ole Miss' roster this fall, 32 are on the defensive side of the ball -- including 15 new defensive backs. Ole Miss came away with five veteran senior DBs with previous FBS experience in cornerbacks **DeShawn Gaddie Jr.** (North Texas) and **Zamari Walton** (Georgia Tech), and safeties **Daijahn Anthony** (Liberty), **John Saunders Jr.** (Miami [OH]) and **Teja Young** (FAU). Combined among the five of them, they own an impressive total career line at the FBS level of 202 games played, 138 games started, 565 total tackles, 18 interceptions, 88 passes defended and eight forced fumbles.

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin heads into his fourth season at the helm of the Ole Miss football program after leading the Rebels to three straight bowl appearances in his first few years in Oxford.

The Rebels once again ranked amongst the top of the nation in multiple offensive statistics in 2022. Ole Miss was No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4). Kiffin helped mentor and recruit talented true freshman running back Quinshon Judkins. Judkins set the Ole Miss single-season record in both rushing yards (1,567) and rushing touchdowns (16)

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. That included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, part of an ongoing nine-game home win streak for Kiffin's teams.

The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll; its highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). Ole Miss has eclipsed 600 yards of total offense seven times under Kiffin after hitting that mark just 16 times in the program's history before his arrival.

The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game this season compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020, leading the program to an Outback Bowl win over No. 7 Indiana and a 5-5 record against an all-SEC schedule. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set during the Tigers' run to a national title in 2019.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first season at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3. Statistically, the Owls finished in the top-25 in 16 team categories, including: No. 2 in passes intercepted, No. 5 in first-down offense, No. 6 in rushing offense, No. 8 in kickoff return defense, red zone offense and turnovers lost, and No. 9 in total offense and turnover margin (by comparison, FAU was No. 72 the previous season in total offense and No. 99 in turnovers gained).

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranks as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying a starting quarterback and then developing Blake Sims in 2014. With three-year starter and All-American AJ McCarron off to the NFL, Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

GAME ONE #22 OLE MISS 73, MERCER 7

Sept. 2, 2023

Attendance: 60,097 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss football opened its 2023 season with a 73-7 blowout win over Mercer at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

It only took 51 seconds for Lane Kiffin's offense to get all 60,097 fans inside Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on their feet. Dart marched the Rebels downfield, needing only three plays to find the endzone, connecting with Harris on a 38-yard strike.

After a quick answer from Mercer, Dart and Harris linked up for two more scores, giving the senior wideout three touchdowns in the first 3:15 of the game. Ole Miss' special teams unit forced their first fumble of the season just before Harris' third score, recovering the loose ball on a kickoff at the Mercer 20-yard line.

Ole Miss continued to assert its offensive dominance on their next drive, as Preseason All-American Quinshon Judkins waltzed in for six to put the Rebels up 28-7 and mark the most points scored in an opening quarter of a season dating back to 1967.

Mercer began the second quarter driving into Ole Miss territory. The Rebel defense took advantage of the situation and brought the house, forcing a fumble on the snap that was recovered by Reginald Hughes and cashing in on the turnover with a 31-yard field goal by Caden Davis.

After forcing Mercer into another punt, the Rebels drove back down the field with a heavy dose of Judkins. With just 32 seconds left in the half, Judkins would take a direct snap at the Mercer 3-yard line and run it in for his second score of the day. Ole Miss went into halftime with a 38-7 lead.

Ole Miss put up 28 points in the third quarter, beginning with a Jordan Watkins 70-yard punt return touchdown at the end of Mercer's first drive of the half.

Daijahn Anthony grabbed his first interception as a Rebel on the next drive, picking off Carter Peevy at midfield and returning the ball for 19 yards. Three plays later Dart would throw his fourth touchdown pass of the game to Harris, tying his career-high previously set during his freshman season at USC.

Spencer Sanders made his Ole Miss debut on the Rebels' next drive and threw for his first two touchdowns in a Rebel uniform on back-to-back drives. He connected on a six-yard pass to Ulysses Bentley IV for his first and 34-yard pass to freshman Cayden Lee for his second one, putting the Rebels up 66-7 heading into the final quarter.

Walker Howard entered the game at quarterback in the fourth quarter to make his Rebel debut as well. Howard and Matt Jones teamed up for a touchdown drive, with Howard connecting on deep passes of 29 and 16 yards to move down the field. Jones would cap off the drive with his second career touchdown, scoring from one yard out.

GAME TWO #20 OLE MISS 37, #22 TULANE 20

Sept. 9, 2023

Attendance: 30,000 • Yulman Stadium • New Orleans, La.

NEW ORLEANS — No. 20 Ole Miss football found itself in a 17-7 hole in the late stages of the first half, but the Rebels used a complete second half and closed the game on a 30-3 scoring run to best the 22nd-ranked Tulane Green Wave, 37-20, at Yulman Stadium on Saturday.

The Rebels (2-0) were stymied early by a stout Green Wave (1-1) run defense, while Tulane hit on some crucial early plays to take that 17-7 lead, but Ole Miss came out of the second half on a mission, using big plays in each facet of the game to come out of New Orleans with the victory.

Ole Miss struck first and struck fast, taking an early 7-0 lead in only 48 seconds, with Dart hitting wideout Tre Harris with 14:12 on the clock for their fourth score in five quarters of play on a 31-yard touchdown strike.

The Green Wave responded at 9:37 in the first quarter with a touchdown run by Makhii Hughes in the wildcat from two yards out, the beginning of a 17-point unanswered stretch by Tulane across the first half. That included a 44-yard field goal at 14:10 in the second quarter by Valentino Ambrosio and a 41-yard touchdown pass from Kai Horton to Jha'Quan Jackson at 5:49.

Ole Miss would break the drought with 1:36 to play in the half, tacking on a 37-yard field goal from Caden Davis to head into the break down 17-10.

That field goal would be the beginning of a 30-3 final scoring run for the Rebels, however, as sophomore running back Quinshon Judkins found the endzone with 6:11 in the third quarter to pull the game to a 17-17 tie.

That set up an early fourth quarter field goal, as Caden Davis hit his second of the day, this one from 27 yards out to give Ole Miss a 20-17 lead with 12:50 to play.

Tulane proceeded to chart the longest drive of the game, a plodding 14-play, 45-yard sequence that gobbled up 6:01 of clock time, but ended with a huge momentum-shifting turnover on downs when Horton came up a yard short on a 4th-and-2 that was originally called a first down before a booth review overturned it and gave the ball to the Rebels.

The Rebels found the endzone not long after, with Dart connecting with Michael Trigg on a 21-yard score to take a 27-17 lead with 4:28 to play.

Tulane responded with another long drive that took 10 plays and went 67 yards before a 26-yard field goal from Ambrosio, but it only took 1:32 off the clock.

From there, Ole Miss went into cruise control, with Caden Davis knocking down his third field goal of the day — the fourth-longest field goal in school history at 56 yards — and Jared Ivey taking a Khari Coleman sack fumble back 26 yards for a touchdown to put Ole Miss on top 37-20 and complete a 30-3 scoring run from the closing stages of the second quarter.
