#### FIRST-AND-10

» Boston College returns to action for the second half of its season beginning at Georgia Tech Saturday, Oct. 21 for a Noon ET kickoff.

» Saturday's game will be broadcast nationally on ACC Network.

**Chris Cotter** (play-by-play) and former BC linebacker **Mark Herzlich** (analyst) are in the booth with **Sherree Burruss** (reporter) on the sidelines.

» Coverage on the Boston College Sports Network begins 30 minutes prior to kickoff on WEEI 93.7 FM. **Jon Meterparel** (play-by-play) is joined on the call by former BC linebacker **Pete Cronan** in the booth and quarterback **Scott Mutryn** on the sideline.

» Boston College trails the all-time series, 4-7, in 2021; a 41-30 Eagle victory. BC is 3-3 all-time against the Yellow Jackets on the road.

» The series started in 1972 with Georgia Tech home victory. The Eagles have won two of three road games since joining the ACC.

» Boston College started the season 1-3 for the second consecutive year and fifth time since 2011. The Eagles last rallied from 1-3 to reach a bowl game in 2017.

» Quarterback **Thomas Castellanos** ranks third in the country for rushing yards by a QB at 512. With 1,143 passing yards, he is one of three QBs in the country with 1,000 passing yards and 500 rushing yards. He is tied for the FBS lead in QB rushing TDs at seven.

» Wide receiver **Ryan O'Keefe** surpassed 200 career catches vs. Virginia and sits at 207, 10th most in FBS among active players.

» O'Keefe suffered a neck injury during the fourth quarter of a week-five win over UVA. He returned to campus on Sunday from Mass General following tests and observation on Saturday night.

» **Lewis Bond** is BC's top receiver at 356 yards on 24 receptions and five touchdowns, which is third in the ACC, 26th in FBS.

#### WEEK SIX RECAP

Saturday, Oct. 7: Boston College 27, Army 24  
Michie Stadium (West Point, N.Y.)

» **Thomas Castellanos** rushed for four touchdowns, including the game-winner with 25 second left in the fourth quarter, and a season-high 142 yards.

» BC rushed for 321 yards as running back **Pat Garwo** added 111 yards on the ground.

» The Eagles became the first team to hold Army scoreless on its first drive of the game and first to score against the Black Knights in the first quarter.

» Castellanos became the first BC quarterback to rush for four touchdowns in a game and combined with Garwo to be the first Eagle teammates to each go over 100 rushing yards for the first time since AJ Dillon and David Bailey at Syracuse in 2019.

#### TOTAL OFFENSE

» BC is moving the ball at a clip of 394.3 yards per game, which ranks 65th in the country after averaging 310.3 in 2022.

» The Eagles have surpassed 400 yards of offense in three games, equaling last season's total.

» The run game is up from 63.2 (last in FBS, last in ACC) to 193.7 (24th, 2nd) yards per game this year.

» BC ran for a season-high 321 yards at Army (10/7) for its third 200-yard game of the year. The Eagles only twice went over 100 yards in 2022 and have gone over 100 in each game this season.

» **Thomas Castellanos** ranks 38th in the country and fifth in the ACC with 273.8 yards of total offense per game.

#### 125<sup>TH</sup> SEASON



» Established in 1893, Boston College football celebrates its 125th season in 2023. The program twice overcame being disbanded, having missed the 1900 season and five seasons from 1903-1907.

» BC's first game was a 4-0 win, with touchdowns worth four points, over St. John's Literary Institute on Oct. 20, 1893. BC played its first home game, a 10-6 win over BU, at the South End Grounds; home of the National League's Boston Braves from 1871-1914.

» The start of the 1913 season marked the first year of football operations in Chestnut Hill and a game vs. Holy Cross on Oct. 30, 1915 celebrated the dedication of Alumni Field.

## The Gregory P. Barber '69 and Family Head Football Coach

Jeff Hafley was introduced as The Gregory P. Barber '69 and Family Head Coach of the Boston College football program on Dec. 14, 2019.

On the recruiting trail, Hafley and his staff have signed two of the top recruiting classes in school history. The 2021 and 2022 signing classes earned ESPN's best ranking in program history since its rankings began in 2006. BC also earned its best showing in the 247 Sports rankings and was awarded its first Rivals top-30 class since 2004.

In 2022, Hafley and the Eagles picked up the program's first win over a ranked opponent since 2018 and first over an AP-ranked opponent since 2014 when BC upset No. 16 NC State on the road. The season was highlighted by wide receiver Zay Flowers rewriting the Boston College record book. Flowers set BC single-season and career records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns.

Flowers became the fourth All-American under Hafley as he earned recognition from the AP. He also led the Eagles' seven-player All-ACC contingent as a first-team pick.

One of college football's top defensive minds, Hafley's defense ranked third nationally in passing yards allowed (173.5 per game) in 2021. The Eagles were top-30 nationally in six other defensive categories: total defense, red zone defense, first downs allowed, third down percentage, team passing efficiency, and defensive touchdowns. His disciplined squad led the ACC in fewest penalties and fewest penalty yards.

A total of 12 Eagles were All-ACC selections, led by First Team offensive linemen Zion Johnson and Alec Lindstrom. Johnson was named to seven different All-America teams and was selected 17th overall in the first round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Chargers, becoming the 21st first round pick in school history.

In his first season on the Heights in 2020, Hafley finished with the most wins of any first-year head coach. Hafley helped improve BC's defense 52 spots in the national rankings in total defense as the Eagles allowed 62 fewer yards per game than the previous year, prior to his arrival. Isaiah McDuffie ranked fifth nationally in total tackles while Max Richardson ended the season 11th as Boston College was one of two schools in the entire country with two players finishing in the top 11 in tackles.

Nine Eagles were named All-ACC in 2020. Tight end Hunter Long was named a Second Team All-American by multiple outlets as he led all tight ends nationally in receptions and finished the year second in receptions.

Prior to taking over as head coach at Boston College, Hafley led a dramatic turnaround in leading the defense for Ohio State as the Buckeyes won the 2019 Big Ten Championship and qualified for the College Football Playoff. A finalist for the Frank Broyles Award and the 247 Sports Defensive Coordinator of the Year, Hafley was one of the architects of a Buckeye defense that ranked first nationally in yards per play, second nationally in total defense, third nationally in scoring defense, third nationally in sacks, seventh nationally in rushing defense, second nationally in passing yards allowed and first nationally in red zone defense.

A standout DB coach throughout his career, Hafley's work as the defensive backs coach at Ohio State led to impressive results. The Buckeyes totaled 15 INTs in 2019, tied for ninth nationally, while allowing just 25 pass plays of 20+ yards.

Before arriving at Ohio State, Hafley spent the previous seven seasons in the NFL, the last three with the San Francisco 49ers as defensive backs coach.

Prior to his time with San Francisco, Hafley was the secondary coach for two seasons in Cleveland, the secondary/safeties coach with Tampa Bay in 2013 and a defensive backs assistant with the Buccaneers in 2012.

His coaching career includes 11 seasons in collegiate football before a move to the NFL, and then seven subsequent seasons there. After starting his career as the running backs coach at Worcester (Mass.) Polytechnic Institute, Hafley moved on to the University of Albany for four seasons as defensive assistant and defensive backs coach (2002-05).

He then coached at Pittsburgh for five seasons (2006-10) under the direction of Dave Wannstedt and helped mentor Darrelle Revis into a Jim Thorpe Award finalist in 2006. Hafley was a defensive assistant/cornerbacks coach in 2006-07 and was secondary coach from 2008-10.

One season as the defensive backs coach at Rutgers, working under Greg Schiano, followed his positions at Pittsburgh. The Scarlet Knights ranked ninth nationally in passing defense in his one season there, 2011. Hafley helped develop future NFL standout defensive backs Duron Harmon and Logan Ryan during his time in Piscataway.

Hafley moved on to the NFL following his year at Rutgers and coached two seasons with the Buccaneers, serving as assistant defensive backs coach in 2012 and secondary/safeties coach in 2013. Two seasons with the Cleveland Browns followed under coach Mike Pettine.

Three seasons as defensive backs coach with the San Francisco 49ers (2016-2018) – preceded Hafley's position with the Buckeyes. He worked under Chip Kelly in 2016 and under Kyle Shanahan the final two seasons. In 2018, the 49ers ranked 11th in the NFL in passing defense. They were 14th in 2016 after ranking 27th the year before Hafley arrived.

Hafley and his wife, Gina, have two daughters, Hope and Leah.

**BY THE NUMBERS: CASTELLANOS**

» **Thomas Castellanos** passed for 305 yards and ran for 95 in BC's week-three game against No. 3 FSU. He became just the 22nd quarterback since 1996 to have gone over 300 and 95 in a game against an AP-ranked Top-25 opponents.

» Castellanos' 10 passing TDs through six games are the second most at BC since 1981, two behind Phil Jurkovec (2020).

» Castellanos' 500 rushing yards lead the team and are second all-time by a BC quarterback in a season.

» Castellanos is one of three quarterbacks in the country with 1,000 passing yards and 500 rushing yards.

**DEEP DRIVE BY CASTELLANOS**

» Transfer quarterback **Thomas Castellanos**, who arrived at BC from UCF after the spring semester, made a scheduled appearance under center for BC's third drive of week one.

» He accounted for all three BC touchdowns and 205 yards of total offense. Castellanos became the first BC quarterback to pass and run for a TD in his first game since Tyler Murphy (2014). He joins Phil Jurkovec (2020) and Anthony Brown (2017) as the only BC quarterbacks since 1981 to pass for two TDs in his first career game at BC. He is the first BC quarterback with three total TDs in his BC debut since Chris Crane (2006 -- one passing, two rushing).

» Castellanos led the Eagles on a game-tying, 83-yard touchdown drive with under two minutes to play; completing a 22-yard pass to **Ryan O'Keefe** and a 30-yard touchdown to **Jaden Williams** on back-to-back plays.

**THIRD-DOWN DEFENSE**

» The BC defense has held opponents under their season average on third-down attempts in four games this season.

» Opponents are 6-for-22 on third-down the last two games.

» BC held Florida State (9/16) to 1-for-9 on third-down.

**RUN STOPPERS**

» The BC defense surrendered a season-low 59 rushing yards against Virginia (9/30).

» Boston College held FSU (9/16) to 128 rushing yards and Army (10/7) 105; both season lows at the time for those two teams.

» In three of their last four games, the Eagles have held their opponent under their season average rushing total.

**PENALTY SHOTS**

» Through three weeks, BC ranked last in FBS and the ACC with 38 penalties committed, averaging 12.67 per game.

» In the last three games, the Eagles have committed just 15 penalties, averaging 5.00 per game.

» BC has committed fewer penalties than its opponent in the last two games, including a season-low three at Army, while the Black Knights, the fifth least penalized team in FBS, committed five.

**GARWO CAN GO**

» Running back **Pat Garwo** produced his fifth career 100-yard game at Army (10/7) and first since a 2021 game at Georgia Tech. He gained 111 yards, including a 50-yard rush against the Black Knights.

» In 2021, Garwo rushed for a then career-high 160 yards at UMass (9/11/21), becoming BC's first 100-yard rusher since David Bailey at Syracuse (Nov. 7, 2020). Garwo's previous career best was 36 yards vs. Pitt (10/10/20).

» He started the remaining 10 games and rushed for 1,045 yards to become the 19th 1,000-yard rusher in BC history; recording the 24th 1,000-yard season by an Eagle.

» Garwo ripped off a career-long 67-yard run for BC's first touchdown to cap off a 99-yard scoring drive in a 41-34 OT win against Missouri (9/25/21).

» Garwo finished with his second 100-yard game of the year and second of his career with a career-high 175 vs. Mizzou.

» Garwo registered four 100-yard rushing games in 2021.

» Named to the Doak Walker Award watch list prior to the 2022 and 2023 season.

**WELCOME TO THE ROBICHAUX**

» Transfer running back **Kye Robichaux** began the season fourth on the depth chart, but injuries thrust him into a feature role in week-two against Holy Cross. He produced a 94-yard game on 19 carries with a touchdown.

» A week later, Robichaux got his first start as an Eagle and went for 64 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries.

» Robichaux has had his number called on seven fourth-down attempts and converted five, including three against FSU.

**O-LINEMAN OF THE WEEK**

» **Christian Mahogany** was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week following BC's win over Virginia (9/30). It marked the first of his career and first of the season for an Eagle.

» He played all 78 snaps and did not allow a quarterback pressure on 30 dropbacks. He graded at an 85.1 pass block by PFF.

» Mahogany and the BC offensive line held UVA without a sack and paved the way for 203 rushing yards; the most by the Eagles against an ACC opponent since 2021.

**LICENSE TO SCORE**

» Redshirt-sophomore wide receiver **Lewis Bond** appeared in eight games with six receptions for 57 yards in his first two seasons.

» Bond, a versatile receiver that can play all three wide out positions, emerged during fall camp as a primary option for the BC quarterbacks.

» He scored his first career touchdown in the season-opener, BC's first touchdown of the season, on an 11-yard catch. A week later, Bond earned his first career start and hauled in a season-high five passes. In week three, he scored on a 32-yard catch-and-run to cap the Eagles' opening-drive en route to an 80-yard game.

» Bond is tied for the team lead in receptions at 23 and leads in receiving yards (350) and touchdowns (5), including his first career two-touchdown game at Louisville (9/23).

**FOURTH-DOWN OFFENSE**

» Head coach **Jeff Hafley** has sent his offense back on the field for 20 fourth-down attempts. The Eagles are 14-for-20 (70%) on fourth-down conversions.

» BC has converted a fourth-down attempt in all six games, two-or-more in five games and a season-high four against Florida State (9/16).

» Boston College's 20 fourth-down attempts rank first among all Power-5 conference teams and its 70.0 conversion rate ranks first in the ACC and 21st in FBS.

**DEPTH ON THE LINE**

» BC has started the same five players on the offensive line in all five games this season. In 2022, the Eagles did not repeat a starting o-line combination until its week-10 win at NC State (11/12/22).

» The Eagles sustained two injuries at right tackle against Virginia (9/30) with starter **Ozzy Trapilo** and back-up **Jude Bowry**, who also filled in at left tackle vs. FSU (9/16) ruled out during the game.

» Graduate lineman **Jack Conley**, who has played primarily in eligible-tackle situations, filled in at right tackle for the final 40 snaps against the Cavaliers. Conley was the only Eagle to start all 12 games on the o-line in 2022; playing both tackle and guard positions.

**BC O-Line Career Starts:** Kyle Hergel (47), Christian Mahogany (28), Ozzy Trapilo (27), Drew Kendall (17), Logan Taylor (16), Jack Conley (15), Dwayne Allick (11), Jackson Ness (7), Nick Thomas (3), Jude Bowry (2), Kevin Cline (2).

**KICKING CONNOR**

» **Liam Connor** took on kickoff responsibilities during his freshman season in 2022. He stepped in as the placekicker in week one against NIU.

» The Leominster, Mass. native connected on all three PAT attempts with the final try tying the game with :05 left on the clock and force overtime. He then made his first career field goal attempt in OT from 39 yards out.

» Connor connected on a career-long 42-yard field goal against Virginia (9/30) and later added a second 42-yard FG that stood as the game-winner with 2:11 left in the game.

**QUARTERBACK ROOM**

» The Eagles added to the QB room through the transfer portal with the addition of **Thomas Castellanos** (UCF).

» Castellanos, who arrived on the Heights at the conclusion of the 2023 spring semester, appeared in five games for the Knights; completing 9-of-16 passes for 75 yards to go with 14 carries for 120 yards and a touchdown.

» Castellanos is the first BC quarterback since at least 1981 with eight touchdown passes and 900 or more passing yards in his first four games. Phil Jurkovec (2020) is the only other BC QB in that time span with eight-plus TDs and 900-plus yards.

» **Emmett Morehead** took over as the starter for the final four games of 2022. His lone win being a come-from-behind victory at No. 16 North Carolina State; snapping the Eagles' streak of 25 consecutive losses to AP-ranked opponents.

» Morehead, UNC's Drake Maye and Temple's E.J. Warner were the only freshman quarterbacks (true freshman or redshirt) in the country with multiple games of 325 passing yards or more and three touchdowns or more.

**THE BALL CARRIERS**

» Behind a five-man All-ACC offensive line in 2021, **Pat Garwo** became the 19th running back in BC history to record a 1,000-yard season. After earning the starting job in week three of that season, he went on to record the 24th 1,000-yard season by a BC running back with 1,045 yards.

» Garwo rushed for 44 yards in week one to lift his career total to 1,687 yards and move into 25th all-time in BC history.

» In 2022, Garwo accrued 402 yards on the ground as his yards per carry average dropped by over two yards from 5.1 to 3.0.

» Garwo is BC's top returning rusher and receiver as he totaled a career-high 241 receiving yards on 29 receptions.

» Sophomores **Alex Broome** and **Cam'ron Barfield** both gained valuable experience as true freshmen. Broome rushed for 202 yards with a team-best 4.6 average, while adding 23 receptions. Barfield contributed 25 carries and three catches.

» Junior **Kye Robichaux** arrived for spring ball from Western Kentucky. A Conference USA Honorable Mention, he rushed for 496 yards and averaged 6.8 per carry. With Broome out for week two and Garwo sustaining a first-quarter injury, Robichaux stepped in and carried the ball 19 times for 94 yards and a touchdown against Holy Cross (9/9).

**WIDEOUT WEAPONS**

» The BC receiver corps is tasked with replacing All-American, first-round pick Zay Flowers, who left as the program's all-time leading receiver in career receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns.

» Sophomore **Joe Griffin** ranks first among returners with 18 receptions for 234 yards and five touchdowns. Griffin was a major target in the red zone last season, including his game-winning score in the final moments in an upset at No. 16 North Carolina State.

» Graduate transfer **Ryan O'Keefe** (UCF) brings an impressive résumé to the offense. He is a two-time All-American Athletic Conference selection and surpassed 1,000 all-purpose yards in each of the last two seasons. O'Keefe logged a team-high five receptions in week one against NIU.

» Redshirt-senior **Dino Tomlin**, who arrived at BC in the spring of 2022 from Maryland, came on strong late last season. He collected 10 catches for 181 yards.

» A mix of veterans, **Lewis Bond**, who scored his first career touchdown vs. NIU, and **Taji Johnson**, and young receivers round out a deep and talented group.

**TAKACS AND THE TIGHT ENDS**

» **George Takacs**, in year two as a graduate transfer from Notre Dame, remains the veteran presence of the tight end group. His 256 receiving yards are the most of any returner on the team as he hauled in 26 catches.

» Takacs accounted for 15 of his 26 receptions through the first three weeks of 2022 before being slowed by injury.

» **Jeremiah Franklin** gained experience as a rookie with nine games played, including two starts, with five receptions.

» Takacs and Franklin each have one touchdown this season.

**O-LINE WHO?**

» In week one, BC's rushing attack compiled its most productive day since a 163-yard game against Wake Forest in 2021. The Eagles averaged 5.2 yards per carry in week one after averaging 2.1 in 2022 and 4.1 in 2021.

» A week later, BC averaged 4.5 yards per carry with 202 rushing yards; its first 200-yard game since a 213-yard effort at Georgia Tech in 2021. That season, the Eagles went over 200 rushing yards four times and once over 300.

» The BC offensive line combined to miss 33 games in 2022; good for 55% of potential starts.

» At the start of the 2022 season, BC had just four career starts among its active offensive linemen. A year later, the Eagles offensive front boasts 135 starts with the return of guard **Christian Mahogany** and the insertion of transfers **Kyle Hergel** (Texas State) and **Logan Taylor** (Virginia).

» Mahogany is a Preseason All-ACC and Preseason All-America pick, while appearing on the watch list for the Outland Trophy and the Lombardi Award.

» Boston College's o-line room returns coach **Matt Applebaum**, who spent the 2022 season in the same position with the Miami Dolphins. Applebaum coached the BC o-line in 2020 and 2021, with all five linemen earning All-ACC honors.

» BC used nine starting offensive linemen and nine different starting combinations in 2022. **Jack Conley** was the only player to start all 12 games; doing so at four positions.

» Center **Drew Kendall** started 11 games a year ago and earned College Football News Freshman All-America.

» Transfers **Hergel** and **Taylor** both arrive with FBS starting experience. Hergel started two seasons at right guard and earned All-Sun Belt in 2022, while Taylor started all 10 games at left tackle in 2022. Taylor was a teammate of QB **Emmett Morehead** at Episcopal (Va.) High School.

**FRONT FOUR**

» **Donovan Ezeiruaku**, a Preseason All-ACC pick, finished fourth in the league in sacks (8/5) and tackles for loss (14.5) in 2022. His sack total was the most by an Eagle since 2018.

» The Eagles re-insert **Shitta Sillah** to the defensive line after he suffered a season-ending injury in week one of 2022. Sillah has nine career starts, including the opener a year ago, nine TFLs and 4.5 sacks.

» **Neto Okpala** has been a major contributor on special teams through two seasons. He totaled 29 tackles in 2022 with seven TFLs and two sacks.

» **Edwin Kolenge** came on late in 2022 to play the final three games as a true freshman. He made six tackles, 1.5 TFLs, a sack and blocked a punt.

» **Cam Horsley** anchors the group inside at defensive tackle with 35 games and 22 starts under his belt. He made 30 tackles, including 5.5 TFLs, a season ago.

» **Kwan Williams** gained 11 games of experience as a true freshman last season, while **Nigel Tate**, who appeared in just two games in 2021, expects to take on a larger role after not seeing game action in 2022.

**THE LINEBACKERS**

» Sixth-year **Vinny DePalma** is coming off an 87-tackle season, which led the Eagles, in 2022.

» **Kam Arnold** was third on the team last season with 75 tackles to go with two interceptions.

**THE JUNGLE**

» Sixth year corner **Elijah Jones** headlines a unit of young prospects from head coach **Jeff Haffley's** three recruiting classes along with a deep crop of transfers.

» Jones is BC's most experienced player with 55 career games and 36 starts. He posted a career-high 31 solo tackles with two interceptions and 13 PBUs; tied for the most in the ACC in 2022.

» **Cole Batson** started the final two games of 2022 at free safety, while corner **Amari Jackson** broke into the starting lineup as a true freshman with five starts.

» BC added two newcomers to the secondary via the transfer portal in nickelback **Khari Johnson** (Arkansas) and safety **Victor Nelson** (LIU).

**2023 CAPTAINS**

» Boston College elected four captains for this season. **Vinny DePalma**, **Pat Garwo** and **Christian Mahogany** all repeat in this role, while **Donovan Ezeiruaku** joins as a first-time team captain.

**IMPACT TRANSFERS**

» Boston College eight transfers, including three grad transfers, for spring ball and later added quarterback **Thomas Castellanos** (UCF) after the spring semester.

» All nine transfers have earned playing time through the first two games, including five players in the week-two starting lineup.

**COACHING STAFF REALIGNMENT**

» BC elevated quarterbacks coach **Steve Shimko** to offensive coordinator this season, while former head coach **Rob Chudzinski** moved into an on-field role as the associate head coach for offense and offensive development.

» **Matt Applebaum** returned from the NFL to coach the BC offensive line, a unit he led in 2020 and 2021.

» On defense, **Aazaar Abdul-Rahim** and **Sean Duggan** share the responsibilities of co-defensive coordinators.

» BC added former Iowa State head coach **Paul Rhoads**, and mentor to **Jeff Hafley** from their days at Pitt, as outside linebackers coach.

**JOE GO GET IT**

» As a freshman, wide receiver **Joe Griffin** caught five passes for 103 yards, with a long of 36, against Duke (11/4/22).

» It marked the first 100-yard and two-TD game of his career.

» Griffin is the only true freshman wide receiver at BC to record a 100-yard game or two-touchdown game since 1996 and one of just five true freshmen in the country last season with a 100-yard, two-touchdown game as a receiver.

**GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK**

» Defensive end **Donovan Ezeiruaku** led Boston College with 14.5 tackles for loss, eight sacks and three forced fumbles.

» Ezeiruaku was the first Eagle with 10 or more TFLs since linebacker Max Richardson (14.5, 2019) and first with eight or more sacks since Wyatt Ray (9.0, 2018).

**MY COUSIN VINNY**

» **Vinny DePalma** missed all of 2020 with an Achilles injury. The New Jersey native returned in 2021 and finished third on the team in tackles at 54.

» He started six games, including four of the final five at middle linebacker in 2021 before playing the ‘Mike’ in all 12 games in 2022.

» Last year, DePalma was first on the team with 87 tackles, posting a career-high 12 at Notre Dame (11/19/22).

**HEY, ARNOLD**

» Linebacker **Kam Arnold** played cornerback in high school, moved to safety as a freshman in 2020 and then transitioned to linebacker in 2021.

» He has started 21 of the last 22 games at linebacker.

» At Virginia Tech (9/10/22), Arnold made a career-high 12 tackles. He was third on BC with 75 tackles on the season.

**FOOTBALL** (Continued from page 1)



» Frank Cavanaugh took over the program in 1919, launching a College Football Hall of Fame career, coaching eight seasons, including an 8-0 season in 1920; a year in which the team adopted the nickname “Eagles” and capped the campaign with a 14-0 victory over rival Holy Cross in front of 40,000 fans at Braves Field.

» Lou Montgomery became the first Black athlete in BC history in 1938. A year later he established the program record for yard per carry at 9.68; a record that still stands.

» Another CFHOF member, Frank Leahy coached from 1939-40. The 1939 Eagles went 9-2 with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl and the 1940 Eagles claimed a national title with an 11-0 record and a Sugar Bowl victory over Tennessee.

» Charlie O’Rourke scored the game-winning touchdown on a 24-yard run on a play installed by Leahy one day prior.

» QB Mike Holovak led BC to the Orange Bowl at the end of the 1942 season for its third bowl game in four years.

» Holovak later returned as head coach from 1951-59 and went 49-29-3. During that time, BC dedicated Alumni Stadium in a game against Navy on Sept. 21, 1957.

» The Joe Yukica era saw the Eagles post a record of 68-37 from 1968-77. His tenure was highlighted by a season-opening win over No. 7 Texas, 14-13, at Alumni Stadium in 1976.

» Jack Bicknell took the reins of the program in 1981, coinciding with the debut of freshman Doug Flutie at quarterback, and returned BC to a bowl game in 1982.

» Flutie guided the Eagles to eight wins in 1982, nine in 1983 and a 10-2 mark in 1984 as he went on to win the Heisman Trophy. The season was highlighted by a victory at Miami on Flutie’s Hail Mary TD to Gerard Phelan as time expired. BC capped the season with a Cotton Bowl win over Houston.

» Bicknell spent a decade at the helm of the program and accumulated a 59-55-1 record.

» Tom Coughlin replaced Bicknell in 1991 and went 21-13-1 in his brief tenure; putting together eight- and nine-win seasons in the process, including a 41-39 win at No. 1 Notre Dame on David Gordon’s last-second field goal in 1993.

» Tom O’Brien was hired as head coach for the 1997 season and led BC to eight consecutive bowl games beginning in 1999; a streak that would reach 12 for the program.

» O’Brien, the program’s winningest coach, went 75-45 with six bowl victories. His 2004 team won a share of the Big East championship and a year later posted a nine-win season in the program’s first as a member of the ACC.

» Matt Ryan led BC to the first of back-to-back ACC Championship games in 2007. The Eagles reached No. 2 in the country that season before winning a program-best 11 games.

» In 2011 Luke Kuechly won the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award, Lombardi Award and the Lott Impact Trophy.

» Heisman finalist Andre Williams set the program record for single-season rushing yards at 2,117 in 2013.

» BC played its first Red Bandanna Game, honoring 9/11 hero Welles Crowther, with a 37-31 defeat of No. 9 USC in 2014.

» AJ Dillon became the program’s all-time leading rusher in 2019 at 4,382 yards in his third 1,000-yard season.

» In 2022, Zay Flowers left as the program’s leading receiver in receptions (200), yards (3,056) and touchdowns (29).
