This Mississippi Today / Siena College Poll was conducted August 20 - 28, 2023, among 650 Mississippi Likely Voters. Of the 650 respondents, 650 were contacted through a dual frame (landline and cell phone) mode. Telephone calls were conducted in English. Telephone sampling was conducted via a stratified dual frame probability sample of landline and cell phone telephone numbers weighted to reflect known population patterns. The telephone sample was obtained from L2. Data from collection modes was statistically adjusted by gender, age, race/ethnicity, and voter likelihood, a computed score that combines voter history, stated voter likelihood and modeled turnout by respondent to ensure representativeness. It has an overall margin of error of +/- 4.0 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting.
