



OVERVIEW

The study was conducted for CNN by SSRS with a representative sample of registered voters in Georgia. SSRS is an independent research company. Surveys were obtained online (n=850) and by telephone (n=218) for a total sample of n=1,068, from **November 30-December 7, 2023**. The margin of sampling error for total registered voters is +/- **3.3** at the 95% confidence level. The design effect is **1.23**. The study includes an oversample of likely Republican voters based on modeled party affiliation on the L2 voter file. For results among the n=522 likely Republican primary voters, the margin of sampling error is +/- **4.7**. The study also includes an oversample of registered voters ages 18-34 in order to reach a total of **218** registered voters in this age group. For results among registered voters ages 18-34, the margin of sampling error is +/- **7.1**. The oversamples of likely Republicans and of registered voters ages 18-34 are weighted to their proper sizes within results for the full population of registered voters. Results for subgroups with fewer than n=125 unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "SN" because samples of that size carry larger margins of sampling error and can be too small to be projectable with confidence to their true values in the population.

MORE ON METHODOLOGY

A total of n=1,068 registered voters who live in Georgia were surveyed online and by telephone from a registration-based sample purchased by SSRS from L2. Sampled voters were invited to participate in the study through multiple contact methods, including a mailed postcard invitation to a random half of the sample, SMS (text-message) invitation in collaboration with Survey160 to those who had a cell phone number on record, email invitations to those with an email address, and multiple telephone call attempts to a random subset of voters with a telephone number on record. Sampled voters who received the postcard could complete the survey online (including by scanning a QR code on mobile devices) or by calling into a toll-free number. All respondents were screened for age, state of residence, and voter registration status prior to administering the survey. Respondents who said they were under 18, living outside of Georgia, or not registered to vote were excluded from the survey. Surveys were conducted in English.

Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of +/- **3.3** percentage points. Results for the sample of **522** likely Republican primary voters have a margin of sampling error of +/- **4.7** percentage points.

Among the entire sample, **35%** described themselves as Democrats, **33%** described themselves as Republicans, and **31%** described themselves as independents or members of another party.

All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics. The entire sample was weighted to reflect Census figures for the state's registered voters for gender, age, education, and race/ethnicity. The sample was also weighted to parameters from the L2 voter file for National Election Pool (NEP) region. To offset the oversamples of likely Republicans and of voters ages 18 – 34, the three categories of modeled party affiliation (Republican, Democratic, and Other/Non-Partisan) and the three categories of age (18 – 34, 35 – 49, and 50+) were weighted to their correct share of L2's Georgia voter file.

Members of demographic groups not shown in the published crosstabs are represented in the results for each question in the poll. Crosstabs on the pages that follow only include results for subgroups with a minimum n=125 unweighted cases. Results for subgroups with fewer than n=125 unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "**SN**" because samples of that size carry larger margins of sampling error and can be too small to be projectable with confidence to their true values in the population.
