**Subject: Stelson and Perry Neck and Neck in Highly-Competitive PA CD-10 Race;
Majority of Voters in District Oppose National Abortion Ban**

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that Pennsylvania's 10th Congressional District will be a very competitive district this fall, with challenger Janelle Stelson polling just two points behind incumbent Congressman Scott Perry (43-45), with 12% of voters currently undecided. Perry's favorability and job approval ratings are both underwater – his favorability rating is 39/44 and his job approval rating is 38/42. Stelson may be less familiar to voters, with 40% unsure how they feel about her, but she has a net positive favorability rating of 6 points (33-27) among those who do have an opinion of her.

Abortion will be a key factor in the race. A strong majority (65%) of voters say they would oppose a national ban on abortion with no exceptions, while only 16% would support it. Those who oppose include almost half (48%) of Republicans and 64% of independents. Voters who are undecided in the Congressional race oppose a national abortion ban by 36 points.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 532 voters from Pennsylvania's 10th Congressional District from April 24-25, 2024. The margin of error is +/- 4.3%. 58% of interviews for the survey were conducted by text message and 42% by telephone.
