

Do you have trouble with your hand and arm after a stroke?

Do you have difficulty getting to therapy visits?

Try Telerehab Occupational Therapy at the Medical University of South Carolina

Live visits with an occupational therapist from the comfort of your home.

We are looking for patients who...

- Have arm and/or hand weakness with at least some movement in their arm
- Have difficulty getting consistent transportation to therapy visits **OR** prefer virtual visits
- Live at home (i.e. not in a rehab or nursing facility) – can be alone or with a caregiver
- Are able to connect to virtual visits on any video-capable personal device, such as a smart phone, computer, or tablet. We are also able to see patients through the MUSC Regional Network in the Telehealth rooms at each clinic (Florence, Greenville, Indian Land, Okatie, Tidelands)



The program is fully grant funded, so there is **no cost for treatment**. Patients without insurance coverage are welcome. Telerehab OT provides an innovative, collaborative approach to therapy using virtual visits to guide stroke recovery. Patients and caregivers are guided and coached through individualized activities to improve performance with activities of daily living, arm and hand function, and quality of life. Patients may also have an opportunity to supplement live therapy with at-home game-based technology developed by MUSC and Clemson University.
