



BIRDIEST FESTIVAL IN AMERICA! announces 2025 Keynote speaker!

Kevin Karlson, an accomplished birder, author, professional tour leader, wildlife photographer and instructor, is a regular at bird and nature festivals in North America, for keynote presentations, bird identification and

photography workshops. At Corpus Christi's eighth birding festival, April 23-27, Kevin will present, "Through the Looking Glass: Reflections of a Grateful Birder."

This light-hearted presentation examines birdwatching through Kevin's eyes exploring why so many humans enjoy watching and studying birds; and the unique camaraderie fellow birders naturally form. He'll share photos of birds, people and other creatures from many locations, as well as humorous stories that make the hobby life-long. He has authored several guide and photography books, and laminated fold-out guides.



Forty-five years of casual to passionate birding has shaped Kevin's life multiple ways, much of it revolving around study and enjoyment of birds and appreciation for the journey. Come along for a trek through time to which we all can relate, with birds, people and unique locals. He has cut back on many bird-related activities, so Karlson's Keynote speech Friday evening, April 25, is a special one.

ne hundred fifty bales of fresh hay soon will arrive to build the fourth *HayMazing* adventure with partner Ocean Drive Garden Club. Opening October 19 dressed for Halloween, the maze will evolve to holiday décor in time for Holly Days at the Gardens, and close January 1.

Youngsters' sense of direction is challenged by the maze, only one bale high so parents easily can monitor activity. Lots of seasonal photo ops await.

This hay-mazing adventure is included in daily general admission. Holiday closures are Thanksgiving Day, December 24, 25.



Board of Directors' Strategic Plan Committee leads progress through next few years of immediate projects, orderly Master Plan development

Board President Callie Walker has appointed Dr. Robert Furgason, Gloria Hicks, Joe Schenk, Patty Nuss, Bob Paulison, Kitty Walker and Mel Powell to join her on the **Strategic Plan Committee**, with Executive Director Michael Womack and Marketing Director MaryJane Crull, staff advisors.

This group has identified immediate projects creating new exhibits or other Gardens additions including:

- Expediently adding the new rear gate entrance and fence extensions, plus security fencing along new S. Oso Parkway in front of the Education and Administration facilities, all matching bronze aluminum fencing of the current front gate—an emergency exit once the new gate is ready. New entrance signage at Staples and S. Oso Parkway and the new gate will accompany this change.
- ▶ Gathering estimates to build the third conservatory in front of the Samuel Jones Orchid structures.
- > Selecting a local architect for future Visitors Center design. Letters of interest, references were requested.
- ▶ Drafting a detailed Strategic Plan for the next three to five years covering mission, funding, growth, organization and governance aligning with the Master Plan, a capital campaign and visitor expectations.

As many as 15 pieces of creative native wildlife sculptures using rebar, rebar-tie wire and welding, such as a *Sleeping Deer* and *Blue Heron*, should be on display in time for Moonlight LUAU in the GARDENS, October 4, remaining at least through mid-November for visitors. Ian Manseau, graduate instructor at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi Art Department, made the assignment for his fall semester Sculpture I students.

The exhibit previews at the fundraiser, with an **artist reception / exhibit opening 6-7:30 pm**, **Friday**, **October 11**, for Botanical Gardens members and artists' guests. Sculptures will be displayed along the walkway between the Hummingbird Garden and Tortoise Enclosures.

Parrots Happy to see guests again!

It was a bang-up Fourth of July for our parrots which began rotating from their indoor Parrot Hut hideaway, where they were protected from Avian Flu during spring migration for wild birds, to their normal outdoor enclosures along the Bromeliad Conservatory walkway!

Since we are an animal sanctuary for rescued parrots, we complied with USDA's Animal Welfare Act regulations, which require a staff member to be outside near the enclosures when birds are there. The enclosures were retrofitted with added safety features to a v o id cross-contamination.

Parrots are outside for visitors mornings, 9-12 daily. At noon, the outdoor parrots take turns in the Reptile Room until closing. On bad weather days, one bird will be in the Reptile Room for visitors.

Parrots again can be included in Private Encounters upon request. Reservations are made at 361-852-2100.
