Creeds, such as the Apostolic and Nicene creeds, have shaped the core of the Christian faith. It is therefore surprising that for over a century there has been no comprehensive collection of the early Christian creeds in their original languages. However, the study of their history has made excellent progress. In the general introduction to this volume, Wolfram Kinzig summarizes the present state of research. This is followed by a collection of all creeds, credal formulae, and creed-related texts of the early Church in Greek and Latin, covering the whole period from the writings of the New Testament down to the early Middle Ages. The source texts are taken from the most up-to-date critical editions available. Furthermore, newly found texts have been added. They are accompanied by English translations and introduced by remarks on their authorship, date, and provenance. The volumes feature useful notes and cross-references which facilitate the study of this complex corpus of texts.
