

This book attempts to illuminate the various aspects of intersubjectivity and to introduce new horizons to the field by bringing different philosophers into philosophical dialogue. It strives to clarify Husserl's phenomenology of intersubjectivity with its multiple dimensions and compares it with the ideas developed by Scheler, Heidegger, Merleau-Ponty, Schutz, Buber, and Habermas. The book also draws Husserl's phenomenology of intersubjectivity into dialogue with Levinas's phenomenology of intersubjectivity and attempts to promote cross-cultural philosophical dialogues between Western and Eastern philosophers such as Husserl and Confucius, Scheler and Mencius as well as Hutcheson and Chong Yak-Yong.
