YVES M. HANRY is Professor of Political Science and Classics at the University of Toronto. He is the author of *Greeks and Romans in Classical Athens* (2007), *Greek Political Thought* (2007) and *Struggles in the Democratic Polis: Ideology and Change in Classical Athens* (2009). He edited *A Companion to Greek and Roman Political Thought* (2010) and is co-editor of *The Oxford Handbook of Thucydides* (2015).

YVES M. HANRY (PhD 1993) was a study of Thucydides in self-defence. He now works in the public humanities in Seattle, Washington.

JASON CAWLEY is a Senior Lecturer in Ancient History at Manchester Metropolitan University. His major research interest is the psychology of combat, particularly the characteristics of the soldier favoured by the classical Greeks. His first book, *The Psychology of the Ancient Hoplite: The Culture of Combat in Classical Greece*, which applies modern models of combat modernism to the ancient world, was published in 2012, and subsequent publications have explored both the human experience of war and the effects war has on those who survive the experience.

EMMA MARY WATKINS is Associate Professor of Greek and Latin at the Catholic University of America. She is a specialist in Greek history, literature and politics, especially of the 5th and 4th centuries BCE. She is the author of *Nichomach Agency and the "Great Man" in Classical Greece* (2014) and most recently of several chapters on the context and reception of tragedy and on the historical works of Xenophon. Her current research centres upon the rhetoric of leadership and democracy.

ANITA MONTAGNARI is Senior Lecturer in Ancient Greek History at Cardiff University. Her research interests are ancient Greek historiography, especially Thucydides and Xenophon, history and international relations in antiquity, memory and performance studies. She is the author of *Exile in Thucydides: Memory and Historical Narrative* (2012) and a co-editor of *Shaping International Law and Historical Narrative* (2012).
