

This volume, based on several sessions of the ISBL held in Vienna in 2014, addresses the Byzantine experience of the Bible. The wide range of source materials addressed in this collection of essays—from manuscripts and military handbooks to lead seals and pilgrim guides—allows insights into a vivid liturgical tradition which shapes Orthodox Christianity to the present day. The volume draws attention to the multiple strategies for the engagement with the Biblical text and explores the manifold ways in which the Bible message was experienced, articulated and brought to life on a daily basis.
