ORDER-IN-COUNCIL.

AT a meeting of the Saint John's City Commissioners held at their office in Church Lane on Thursday the 16th. day of July, 1914.

1. The minutes of the previous meeting held on the 18th. day of June last, were read and confirmed.

2. M.P. No. 3088/13.—Disinfection of vessels, relative to,—was considered, and the Commissioners were of opinion that they had no jurisdiction in the matter.

3. M.P. No. 788/14.—Medical Officer of Health, duties of—was considered and the Chairman submitted a By-Law to provide for the appointment of a Medical Officer of Health. It was made and ordered to be engrossed and submitted for the approval of the Legislative Council, in accordance with section 24 subsection (4) of the St. John's City Ordinance, 1907.

4. M.P. No. 1474/14.—By-Law No. 1 of 1912, Vegetable matter removal By-Law 1912, Amendment to,—was considered, and section No. 3 amended to read as follows:—

“The City Commissioners may, by a notice in writing signed by the City Clerk, require any owner to remove from his land and place in a box, barrel, or other proper receptacle, ready for removal by the City Commissioners carts, within the space of three days from the service of each notice, any animal or vegetable matter, or any offensive substance whatsoever.”

5. M.P. No. 2188/14.—Return of cases treated in District No. 1 for May, 1914,—was laid on the table.

6. An application from Elizabeth Williams of Cross Street for a reduction of her City Rate for 1914, was read, and the City Clerk directed to inform her that her application was too late.

7. A report against John D. Byam, acting Sanitary Inspector, by the Medical Officer of Health was read, and the Commissioners requested the Chairman to caution Byam.

8. An application from George W. Lynch, Gardener of the Public Cemetery, for three months' leave of absence, was considered. The Chairman informed the Commissioners that as Lynch wished to go on the 13th. instant, he had granted him the leave asked for, and had appointed Mr. Arthur B. Philpot to act during the time. The Commissioners approved of the Chairman's action.

9. An application by Mr. Samuel R. Christian of North Street to be allowed to erect a shed over the steps of his house, was granted.

10. An application from Louisa Cephas to be allowed to bring a small house into town from Weatherills Estate was refused.

11. Applications from Messrs. Omaley Joshua, Thomas H. Knowles, Samuel C. McGuire, and Henry Rudd, for employment, were read, and the City Clerk directed to inform applicants that there was no vacancy at present.

12. A letter from Dr. A. Wykham *re* Notice served on him to put a cesspit to his stables, was read, and the City Clerk directed to inform Dr. Wykham that he need not build the cesspit if he did not wish to, but that he must not allow the urine from his stables to flow into the Street Gutters.

13. A letter from the City Clerk drawing attention to what he considered a discrepancy in section 38 of the Market By-Law No. 1 of 1908 was considered, but the Commissioners were of opinion there was no discrepancy.

14. A letter from the City Clerk, reporting the bad conduct of Theophilus Martin the Engine driver at Body Ponds, was read, and the Commissioners agreed that he should be dismissed and given a week's pay in lieu of notice.

15. A letter from Messrs. L. S. Cranstoun & J. A. Harney asking for compensation for damage done to their respective properties "Blizzards" and "Body Ponds" Estates through the erection of the new dam at Body Ponds Stream was considered, and it was agreed that the Government be requested to ask the Acting Surveyor of Works to furnish a report on the application of the petitioners.

16. Reports on the water in the Reservoir at Grays Hill for the four weeks from 20th. June to the 11th. of July, were laid on the table.

17. The report on the working of the Public Market for the month of June was read, and showed that the sum of £32. 10. 1. for fees, had been received during the month which was a decrease of £1. 2. 1. on those of the previous month.

18. The results of the ten cases brought before the Magistrate since the last meeting were reported by the City Clerk.

On motion by Mr. Rannie, seconded by Honourable Mr. Griffith the meeting adjourned.
