

Azerbaijan - Earthquake

- An earthquake of magnitude 5.4M and depth 15km occurred in northern Azerbaijan on 4 September at 4.49 UTC. The epicentre was located approx. 10 km south of Oghuz (pop. 7 000). Several aftershocks have been reported.
- According to media the earthquake was felt in some areas of northern and central Azerbaijan, causing panic. As of 4 September morning, there were no reports of damage or casualties.

Pacific – El Niño - Cyclones

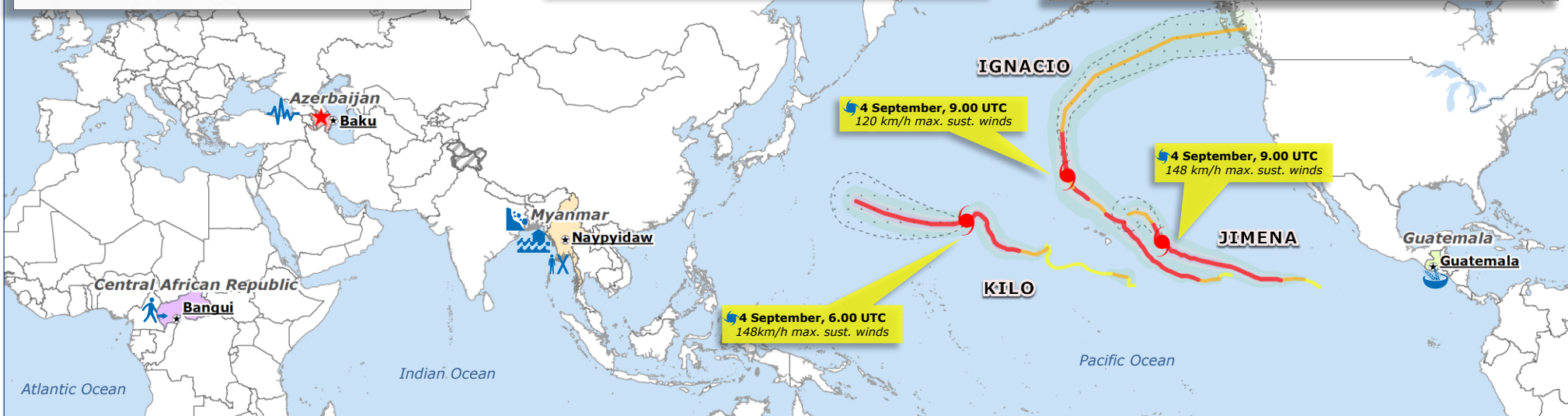
- This cyclone season in the Pacific may be very active, due to the El Niño effect. For the first time since satellite observation started, 3 tropical cyclones of Category 4 (Saffir-Simpson scale) were observed simultaneously across the north East Pacific: Kilo, Ignacio and Jimena were active during the past weekend.
- No humanitarian impact is expected, however, because all are over open water.

Guatemala – Food insecurity

- As a result of the intense drought affecting Central America, in Guatemala, 154 000 families of small producers are estimated to have lost between 75% to 100% of their subsistence crops. Current food assistance programmes are ending or being reduced.
- The current El Niño phenomenon which is affecting the entire region seriously threatens the viability of the second main harvest "Postrera". Moreover, losses in coffee production are already forecast by the national coffee association.

Central African Republic – Internally Displaced People

- The Humanitarian Coordinator has expressed concerns over the Government's decision to close the Internally Displaced People site at the M'Poko airport by 15 September.
- 2 210 families are still living in the site, out of whom 700 are considered as vulnerable.

Myanmar/Burma – Floods and landslides

- Heavy rain is still affecting Myanmar / Burma, especially the northern areas of Sagaing Region and Kachin State, causing more floods and landslides. As of 4 September, media reported flooded areas in Hkamti, as well as in other villages of Sagaing Region, and approx. 1 800 people were sheltered in a camp in Myatheindan Pagoda.
- According to the National Natural Disaster Management Committee report of 2 September, 1.6 million people were displaced over July-August, 122 people have died and over 476 000 houses were partially damaged or destroyed through the country.
- Over the next 48 h, heavy rains and thunderstorms may still affect several areas of Myanmar / Burma, especially the northern and western areas, including Sagaing, Kachin and Rakhine, and some southern coastal areas.
