Sandankyo Valley 三段峽
The Beauty of Changing Nature
 自然がさまざまな姿を愛える MAP-1
Ever-Changing Waters
 変化する水の色
 The 13km ravine is one of the major canyons in Japan. The water runs through woods, splashes over rocks, ever changing in its shape and speed. Walk along the dancing stream to head for Hijiriko, a serene lake surrounded by mountains. A walk to Kurobuchi roughly takes 50 minutes, while it takes about 2.5 hours to reach Sandankyo.
Five Highlights
 5つの見どころ
 Along the walking course are five particularly popular spots. Nidandaki (double-tiered falls), Sandandaki (triple-tiered falls) and Miusudaki (triple falls) are known for their picturesque beauty, while at Kurobuchi (black depth) and Sarutobi (monkey flight), the stream comes to a short halt, and small boats carry passengers to cross it.

 Kurashiki, city of abundance, once prospered under the direct supervision of the Edo Shogunate. Walk along the main street, with its adjacent river, and you can catch glimpses of the traditional culture cultivated by the citizens through generations of being merchants.

A Masterpiece Formed of a Japanese Garden
 「日本庭園の最高峰」 MAP-3
A Garden and a Work of Art
 庭園も「作品」
 “Gardens should be appreciated as a piece of artwork,” Adachi Zenko, the museum founder, once remarked. The beautiful rock gardens, expanses of white gravel, well-manicure pines and moss along with the ponds are all a dynamic expression of its creator, Yokoyama Taikan. The garden displays the artist flourish of this master of Japanese paintings, and it has won the Best Japanese Garden by the US publication *Journal of Japanese Gardening* (JOG) for ten years running.
1500 Artworks by Masters
 巨匠たちの絵1500点
 Japanese paintings, depicted with pigment paints unique to the culture, boast delicate expressions and colors different from Western oil paintings. Adachi Museum of Art houses approximately 1500 paintings and works of art, including an extensive collection of works by Yokoyama Taikan, one of the most distinctive figure in the Japanese painting.

Cycling Across the Ocean
 海の上を自転車で行く MAP-8
Tour Along the Sea Road by Bicycle
 自転車での海の道を走る
 The Shimanami Kaido Expressway was built for motorized vehicles, but has an extra lane for cyclist and pedestrians. With a total of 15 rental terminals covering the entire route, the “cycle road across the ocean” attracts many tourists. A slow ride across The Seto Inland Sea may take up to approximately 10 hours, but you can turn around any time.
Sparkling Ocean beyond Tiled Roofs
 瓦屋根の向こうに瀬戸内海
 In the City of Onomichi, myriads of temples and houses cling to the mountain slopes. Climb up narrow, steep passages between houses or hop on a ropeway gondola to visit the Senkoji temple on the mountaintop, where the breathtaking view of the Seto Inland Sea unrolls beyond the rows of traditional tiled roofs.

 Boasting sparkling white sand and blue water, Tottori Sand Dunes is also a renowned sports mecca. The soft, sandy ground provides a safe paraglider flight over the Sea of Japan even for novice pilots while it offers a great playground for sandboarders and those just looking to take a break.
Meet Sand Arts at a Museum

 The unique Sand Museum located near Tottori Sand Dunes was first conceived to create and display artworks by using the Dune sand. Annually, artists around the world produce sculptures under the yearly theme. Thanks to some recent remodeling, the display area has now become weatherproof, allowing visitors to enjoy the artworks all year-round.

Sprawling Creation of Nature Over and Under the Ground
 地上と地下にひろがる自然の造形美 MAP-6
Water-Made Sculptures in Akiyoshido
 水が彫った秋芳洞の彫刻
 Under the plateau of Akiyoshidai lies the gigantic limestone cavern, Akiyoshido. A 1km walking path runs through the cave. Once you step inside, this breathtaking marvel of nature, created through years of work by the ground water, will captivate your eyes. A stroll along the entire course takes less than an hour.
Japan's Largest Karst Plateau

 A long, long time ago, Akiyoshidai was born as a coral reef under a tropical sea. The vast grassland with pillars of limestone scattered all over makes for a truly bizarre sight. Stroll along the grassy paths to feel the breeze from the dawn of time.

Izumo Taisha Grand Shrine 出雲大社
Where Gods Gather from Across the Land
 日本中の神様が集う社 MAP-2
The Gateway to the World of Myths
 神話世界への入り口
 Izumo is one of the main places in Japanese mythology, and Izumo Taisha lies at the heart of these myths. It enshrines Okuninushi-no-Okami, the founding god of the land of Japan, and the shrine's foundation is recorded in arguably the oldest Japanese history book. The world of mythology awaits you.
Meeting of Myriads of Gods
 大勢の神様のミーティング
 Okuninushi-no-Okami is also known as the god of En-musubi. En means all of the connections that a blind people together. Once a year, gods from all over the country are believed to congregate here at Izumo Taisha to discuss their "en". The shrine is even outfitted with accommodation facilities for gods.

Mitokusan Nageiredo Temple 三徳山投入堂
Temple Tossed Up by a Holy Man from the Mountain's foot
 聖人がふもから投げた建物 MAP-4
A Miracle Awaits At the End of a Rocky Road
 険しい山道の果ての奇跡
 Nageiredo Temple is dedicated for *shugenshi* (practitioners of asceticism). To visit, borrow a *wagasa* (a ringed strap for monks) at the mountain reception desk and climb up the steep mountain path for 40 to 50 minutes. All of a sudden, you will reach the spot where you can get the clear view of a sheer cliff, on which Nageiredo Temple stands. Many feel awestruck by the miraculous sight.
The Seat of Buddha Upon a Sheer Cliff
 断崖絶壁に建つ仏の座
 In a bold temple together in the middle of a vertically rising cliff, a small wooden temple stands. When or by whom it was built is unknown. A legend says it was Ennoyojo, the founder of *shugendo* (mountain asceticism), who tossed the entire building from the foot of mountain up on the present spot a thousand years ago. The building is a registered as a national treasure.

Kintaikyō Bridge 錦帯橋
Toughness and Beauty Blend in the Arched Wooden Bridge
 強く美しい木のアーチ橋 MAP-7
Flood-Proof Bridge Structure
 洪水に負けない橋
 Japanese architecture could best be described as a “culture of wood,” thus its bridges have been mainly wood-made until recently. Stone abutments are connected by the arching wood bridges. The outstanding cross-linking technology originated in the Edo era and continues to receive high praise to this day. The bridge is replaced regularly to maintain the skill and know-how.
The Combined Beauty of Castle, Bridge and River
 城・橋・川、一体美
 On the mountaintop on the west side of Kintaikyō Bridge is Iwakuni Castle. The gentle flow of Nishiki River and the unique silhouette of the Kintaikyō Bridge create a picturesque view. A ropeway service is available up to the top of mountain.

Korakuen Garden 後樂園
The Garden of Comfort for Samurai Lords
 藩主がくつろぐ庭 MAP-10
Borrowed Landscape
 「借景」
 The garden epitomizes the samurai culture flourished in the *genroku* era (1688 - 1704). 14 years were spent to complete this private sanctuary of the local lord. One of the main concepts behind the landscaping works was “shakkei (borrowed landscape)”. The meticulous layout makes neighboring Okayama Castle and faraway mountains look as if they are integral parts of the garden view.
Kyokusui (bending stream)
 曲水
 One of the essential components in Japanese gardening is “water”. Korakuen Garden, one of the three most beautiful parks in Japan, features a small canal bending softly in the middle of the garden. The water also runs through a rest house, *Ryuten*. Soak in this Japanese mode of relaxation while being serenaded by the soothing stream.
