The Adaptive Design Association builds custom adaptive equipment for children with disabilities, using readily available, affordable materials like cardboard and white glue. Your contribution will ensure more children with disabilities receive the custom equipment they need to lead healthy lives and meet their full potential. In a typical year, we use 200 sheets of triple-wall cardboard, 20 gallons of white glue, and 10 cases of hot glue to build hundreds of adaptive pieces for kids in NYC.

Beginning with a guided tour, of our studio you will see, touch, and try unique, fun solutions for improving accessibility. Our experts will then lead a hands-on workshop. You will learn about the basics cardboard carpentry techniques and/or switches and circuitry. No experience is necessary.
