■ By order in proceeding on applications of Black Hills Video Corp. for renewal of licenses of seven stations in domestic public point-to-point microwave radio service and modification of one license to cover an additional facility, which were granted on July 2 with conditions, commission granted request by Black Hills to extent of (1) further staying effective date of carriage provisions with respect to CATV system at Rapid City, S. D., to Jan. 15, 1966, subject to all conditions for simultaneous nonduplication protection for local TV's specified in Oct. 29 memorandum opinion and order, and (2) extended to Dec. 30 period within which local TV's or other interested parties may submit further information concerning feasibility of using cable channel 4 at Rapid City. Commissioners Bartley and Cox not participating. Action Dec. 22.

■ In proceeding on applications of Central Broadcasting Corp. and WCRB Inc. for new FM's in Ware and Springfield, Mass., respectively, commission denied applicants' application for review of Oct. 6 action by review board, which, among other things, denied merger portion of their agreement. Commissioners Hyde and Cox dissented. Action Dec. 22.

■ By memorandum opinion and order, commission granted application of Charter Broadcasting Corp. of Mass. for new FM to operate on channel 291 (106.1 mc), ERP 23 kw, ant. height 190 ft., in Hyannis, Mass.; denied oppositions by E. Anthony & Sons Inc. (WOCB AM-FM West Yarmouth, Mass.) and Woonsocket Broadcasting Co. (WWON-FM Woonsocket, R. I.). Action Dec. 22.

■ By separate memorandum opinions and orders, commission enlarged issues in following AM proceedings to include Sec. 307(b) considerations consistent with its policy statement for broadcast facilities involving suburban communities issued today:

Charles W. Jobbins, Costa Mesa-Newport Beach, Calif., et al.;

Jupiter Associates, Matawan, N. J., et al., and Monroeville Broadcasting Co., Monroeville, Pa., and Miners Broadcasting Service Inc. (WMBA), Ambridge-Allquippa, Pa., and remanded these proceedings to hearing examiners for further hearing and preparation of supplemental initial decisions. Commissioner Cox not participating. Action Dec. 22.

■ By memorandum opinion and order, commission granted application of Radio Thirteen-Eighty Inc. for interim authority to operate AM station on facilities to be vacated by KWK (1380 kc, 5 kw, DA-N, U), in St. Louis. In so doing, it disposed of various applications for review of Sept. 14 decision by review board which denied all requests for interim operation on 1380 kc.

Radio Thirteen-Eighty is composed of seven applicants seeking regular use of this frequency—Archway Broadcasting Corp., Bi-State Radio Inc., Gateway Broadcasting Co., Home State Broadcasting Corp., Prudential Broadcasting Co., Six-Eighty-Eight Broadcasting Co., and St. Louis Broadcasting Co. Other interim applicants who also seek regular operation are Great River Broadcasting Inc., Missouri Broadcasting Inc., Thirteen-Eighty Radio Corp. (through relationship with KWK Broadcasting Corp.), Clermont Broadcasting Co., Victory Broadcasting Co., and Pike-Mo Broadcasting Co. (latter seeking 1390 kc, 500 w, D, in Louisi-
