TWO RIGHT LANES ARE OUT WITH A COLLISION, REALLY SLOW BOTH WAYS.

EAST 401 IS SLOW AS WELL FROM THE 410, FROM RENNE FORTH, TOWARDS THE 409 OUT PAST WESTON AND THAT'S WHERE CREWS ARE STILL IN THE EXPRESS, TWO RIGHT LANES ARE OUT, THAT WAS A STALLED TRACTOR TRAILER.

DON VALLEY PARKWAY, FINCH IN SECTIONS PAST LAWRENCE, THAT'S YOUR BUSIEST STRETCH FOR NOW, BACK TO YOU.

THIS IS ACCORDING TO DRIVERS, CYCLISTS, TO PEOPLE WHO OFTEN USE THE ROADS RIGHT ACROSS THE PROVINCE AND GOOD NEWS OFTEN THIS CAN LEAD TO CHANGE.

THIS STREET, NUMBER 6, A LOT OF REASONS WE ARE SEEING THE ROADS ON THE LIST HAS TO DO WITH CONGESTION AND POTHOLES.

WE'RE ALSO LIVE THIS MORNING IN HAMILTON WHERE WE WANT TO GIVE YOU A LIVE LOOK AT NUMBER ONE ON THIS LIST.

SO THERE IS ABERDEEN AVENUE IN HAMILTON.

ACCORDING TO ROAD MAINTENANCE ALSO TRAFFIC CONGESTION, NUMBER 2, RIGHT HERE IN THE CITY OF TORONTO, EGLINTON AVENUE WEST, NUMBER 3, BARTON STREET EAST, ALSO IN HAMILTON, WE HAVE COUNTY ROAD 42349 PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY AND HURONTARIO OVER IN MISSISSAUGA.

LIST.

THEY DON'T WANT THAT DUBIOUS
DISTINCTION, BUT THEY RECOGNIZE
THE PAIN POINTS AND WE'VE ALSO
HAD TIMES WHERE PEOPLE HAVE
SAID, OH, WE WEREN'T AWARE THAT
IT WAS THAT BIG A PAIN POINT.
AND SO WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT
PEOPLE HAVE A VOICE, BUT THE
VOICE IS ALSO BEING RESPONDED TO
AND OUR ADVOCACY KICKS IN TO
HELP CONSTITUENTS FEEL SAFE IN
THEIR COMMUNITIES.

>> SO THAT'S THE IDEA BEHIND
THIS CAMPAIGN, RIGHT?
IT'S REALLY TO PUT A SPOTLIGHT
ON THOSE TOP 10 ROADS THAT FROM
DRIVERS, FROM CYCLISTS, FROM
PEDESTRIANS, THEY ARE BRINGING
FORWARD THEIR CONCERNS SO THERE
IS THE POSSIBILITY THAT THOSE AT
THE MUNICIPAL LEVEL, THE
PROVINCIAL LEVEL, EVEN THE
FEDERAL LEVEL CAN LOOK AT THE
ROADWAYS AND SAY, HEY, HOW CAN
WE BETTER IMPROVE THOSE
CONDITIONS?

PART OF THE ISSUE OF COURSE FOR
MANY OF THE ROADS IN THE CITY OF
TORONTO, NO SURPRISE HERE, GUYS,
CONSTRUCTION, GIVING YOU A LIVE
LOOK DOWN BLOOR CLOSER TO
SPADINA.

ACTUALLY LIMITED IN SOME AREAS
TO ONE LANE THERE AND THAT CAN
LEAD TO SOME CONGESTION, PEOPLE
LOOKING AT A PRETTY SLOW COMMUTE
AND WE KNOW THAT'S A BIG STORY
WE'RE ALWAYS FOLLOWING.

SO THIS MORNING WE WILL CONTINUE
TO GET REACTION FROM DRIVERS AND
AGAIN GIVE PEOPLE A LOOK AT THAT
TOP 10 LIST.

>> OKAY, CP24'S COURTNEY HEELS REPORTING LIVE, THANK YOU.

>> UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO EXPECTED TO MAKE ITS CASE IN COURT TODAY AS IT SEATS AN INJUNCTION TO DISMANTLE THE ONGOING ENCAMPMENT ON CAMPUS. UNIVERSITY OFFICIALS ARGUE THE PRO-PALESTINIAN ENCAMPMENT IS CAUTION IRREPARABLE HARM TO THE INSTITUTION.

AMONG THE RELIEF SOUGHT, THE UNIVERSITY IS LOOKING FOR AN ORDER WHO AUTHORITY TO ARREST AND REMOVE PERSONS AND STRUCTURES WHO VIOLENT THE TERMS OF THE ORDER.

THE PROTESTERS SAY THEY WILL FIGHT BACK WITH THEIR OWN LEGAL TEAM AND HAVE REFUSED TO LEAVE THE SITE.

DESPITE THE INJUNCTION APPLICATION THE UNIVERSITY'S PRESIDENT DOES SAY U OF.

IT WILL CONTINUE TO ENGAGE IN DISCUSSIONS WITH ENCAMPMENT REPRESENTATIVES AND REMAINS HOPEFUL THAT AN AGREEMENT CAN BE REACHED.

>> MEANTIME, PROTESTERS TOOK TO THE STREETS LAST NIGHT IN RESPONSE TO THE ISRAELI STRIKE ON RAFAH THAT KILLED DOZENS OF CIVILIANS.

PEOPLE GATHERED NEAR THE ISRAELI CONSULATE AT YONGE AND BLOOR BEFORE MARCHING DOWNTOWN TO THE ENCAMPMENT AT THE UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO.

ISRAEL IS FACING NEW CONDEMNATION FOR THE STRIKES THAT LOCAL HEALTH OFFICIALS SAY KILLED AT LEAST 45 PALESTINIANS. ISRAELI PRIME MINISTER BENJAMIN NETANYAHU SAYS THE STRIKES ON RAFAH WERE A TRAGIC MISTAKE, ADDING THAT AN INVESTIGATION IS UNDERWAY.

>> A CEREMONY WILL BE HELD

TONIGHT TO OFFICIALLY RENAME CENTENNIAL PARK STADIUM AFTER LATE FORMER MAYOR ROB FORD. PREMIER DOUG FORD, ROB FORD'S MOTOR, MAYOR OLIVIA CHOW AND OTHERS WILL BE ON HAND AT THE 2200 SEAT STADIUM IN ETOBICOKE. CITY COUNCIL INITIALLY VOTED DOWN THE NOTION TO RENAME THE STADIUM AFTER FORD. TONIGHT'S CEREMONY IS SCHEDULED TO GET UNDERWAY AT 6.

>> A HEAD SCRATCHER HERE, LET'S SORT THIS OUT WITH TONY GRACE THIS MORNING.

TONY, WHAT'S THE MAIN MESSAGE FROM THIS ANTI-SUNSCREEN MOVEMENT?

>> THE VIDEOS THAT ARE MAKING THE ROUND ON TikTok, VARIOUS OTHER SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS, YOU HAVE THE INFLUENCERS WHO ARE TRYING TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE NOT TO USE SUNSCREEN, CLAIMING THAT IT'S DOING MORE HARM THAN GOOD, RAISING FLAGS AND CONCERNS ABOUT THE COMPOUNDS, THE SUBSTANCES THAT MAKE UP SUNSCREEN WHICH THE INFLUENCERS ARE ALWAYS REFERRING TO AS CHEMICALS, BUT, WHICH YOU KNOW, DERMATOLOGISTS POINT OUT TO US, CHEMICALS ARE A VERY BROAD SCIENTIFIC TERM FOR REALLY ANY SUBSTANCE, BUT THE MAIN MESSAGE FROM THIS MOVEMENT APPEARS TO BE THAT SUNSCREEN CAN BE HARMING SKIN, THAT IT'S MORE LIKELY TO GIVE YOU CANCER THAN THE SUN ITSELF EVEN DEPRIVING PEOPLE OF VITAMIN D.

AND YOU ARE ALSO SEEING VIDEOS WITH SORT OF DIY SUGGESTIONS, SHOWING THINGS LIKE ZINC OXIDE, BEES WAX, COCONUT OIL, HOWEVER,

DETERMINOLOGISTS COMING OUT TODAY AND SAYING THAT A LOT OF THIS IS MISINFORMATION. HERE'S A DOCTOR WHO WE SPOKE TO, A DERMATOLOGY AND SKIN SCIENCE PROFESSOR FROM UBC. HAVE A LISTEN.

>> THE CONCERN I HAVE ABOUT THIS MOVEMENT IS THAT IT IS ACTUALLY BASED ON A LOT OF MISINFORMATION.

SO THERE IS NO SOLID EVIDENCE TO SHOW THAT USING SUNSCREEN CAUSES CANCER.

THERE IS A WORLD OF EVIDENCE, THERE IS TONS OF INFORMATION AVAILABLE ACCUMULATED OVER MANY DECADES NOW CONFIRMING THAT THE NUMBER ONE CAUSE FOR SKIN CANCER IS ULTRAVIOLET RAYS FROM SUN EXPOSURE AND ALSO FROM ARTIFICIAL LIGHT EXPOSURE.

>> AND, GUYS, Dr. LINDA ZING FROM OAKVILLE POINTING OUT THAT SHE SEES PEOPLE ALL OF THE TIME WHO HAVE SKIN CANCERS AND OTHER SKIN DAMAGE FROM SUN EXPOSURE FROM NOT BEING PROTECTED IT CAN BE AS SIMPLE AS, YOU KNOW, CLOTHING AND SHADE IF YOU DON'T WANT TO ACTUALLY USE THE SUNSCREEN AND BY THE WAY THERE ARE CHEMICAL AND MINERAL BASED SUNSCREENS OUT THERE, SO DERMATOLOGISTS ENCOURAGING EVERYONE TO SCREEN THE CLAIMS THEMSELVES IF YOU WILL.

REMEMBER IT WAS SHERYL CROW WHO SAID I'VE GOT MY 45 ON, DERMATOLOGISTS SAY YOU NEED 30 OR MORE IN TERMS OF SPF IN YOUR SUNSCREEN TO MAKE A REAL DIFFERENCE AND THEY ARE ENCOURAGING PEOPLE TO THINK ABOUT THIS VERY CAREFULLY AS THESE SOCIAL MEDIA CLAIMS MAKE THE ROUNDS.

>> YEAH, IT'S SO HARD TO SEPARATE FACT FROM FICTION ESPECIALLY WITH ALL OF THE

INFORMATION OUT THERE, BUT VERY IMPORTANT TO STILL APPLY THAT SUNSCREEN, OKAY, TONY GREY FROM CTV, THANKS SO MUCH.
