THE CROWN TELLING THE COURT BOTH SIDES ARE VERY CLOSE TO RESOLUTION.

ACCUSED OF CRIMINAL HARASSMENT AND EXTORTION TWO YEARS AGO AGAINST ANOTHER MEMBER OF THE BARRIE POLICE SERVICE, GARDINER WHO IS 52-YEARS OLD BECAME A BARRIE POLICE OFFICER ABOUT 20 YEARS AGO FOLLOWING A CAREER IN THE NHL.

HE IS REPRESENTED BY THE OFFICE OF COUNSEL SKIM SCHOFIELD. GARDINER WAS ACCUSED OF HARASSING COMMUNICATION AND THREATENING TO RELEASE PHOTOS OF THE OTHER OFFICER.

BARRIE POLICE SAID AT THE TIME THE ALLEGATIONS STEM FROM OFF DUTY INCIDENTS BETWEEN 2016 AND 2018.

THE POTENTIAL RESOLUTION TO THE CASE COMES AS BARRIE POLICE INSPECTOR VALARIE GATES FACES TWO CHARGES OF DISCREDITABLE CONDUCT RELATING TO ON DUTY

INCIDENTS FOLLOWING AN INVESTIGATION BY THE OPP'S OFFICE OF PROFESSIONAL RESPECT, INCLUSION AND LEADERSHIP. IT'S BELIEVED BOTH CHARGES ARE CONNECTED.

SHE'S BEEN A MEMBER OF THE POLICE SERVICE IN BARRIE FOR 22 YEARS AND IS MARRIED TO POLICE CHIEF RICH JOHNSTON. INSPECTOR GATES APPEARED AT THE

BARRIE COURTHOUSE SEVERAL TIMES EARLIER THIS YEAR DURING GARDINER'S PRELIMINARY HEARING PROCEEDINGS.

TODAY GATES WAS INCT ATTENDANCE FOR HER POLICE SERVICES ACT VIRTUAL HEARING ANSWERING TO THE MOST RECENT ALLEGATION OF MISCONDUCT WHICH WAS LAID A FEW WEEKS AGO.
