EVICTIONS IN THE LAST YEAR.
LEGAL, ILLEGAL EVICTIONS.
AND JUST, OVERALL
UNAFFORDABILITY FOR HOUSING.

>> Reporter: THE SHELTER HAS
BEEN AT FULL CAPACITY SINCE

AUGUST.

JULIE SAYS THEY CHECK WITH OTHER SHELTERS ON BEHALF OF THOSE NEEDING ACCOMMODATIONS FOR THE NIGHT.

TWO MONTHS AGO, OFF THE STREET MOVED FROM A FIRST COME FIRST SERVE BASIS TO A SIGN UP LIST EACH MORNING FOR THE FOLLOWING NIGHT.

>> IT HAS BEEN HELPING TO KIND OF STREAMLINE THE INTAKE PROCESS.

BUT THEN ALSO IF PEOPLE ARE ON THE WAIT LIST, LIKE HEY, WE ARE FULL TONIGHT, YOU ARE NOT GUARANTEED A COT, THEY HAVE A FULL DAY TO PLAN THE DAY ACCORDINGLY, AND REACH OUT TO FRIENDS AND FAMILY AND SEE IF THEY CAN STAY THERE FOR THE NIGHT.

NETWORK HAVE ALERTS FOR MORE SPACES TO BE OPENED OVERNIGHT. CTV NEWS, SUDBURY.

>> MILD TEMPERATURES AND NO SNOW MEANS ICE SKATERS IN SAULT STE. MARIE HAVE LIMITED OPTIONS FOR OUTDOOR SKATING.

BUT THE RINK AT THE NEW DOWNTOWN PLAZA HAPPEN OPEN FOR SEVERAL WEEKS NOW, BECAUSE THERE IS A KEY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN IT AND OTHERS THROUGHOUT THE CITY. MIKE MCDONALD REPORTS.

>> Reporter: SYNTHETIC ICE WHICH STAYS COLD AND ABOVE ZERO TEMPERATURES IS WHAT IS ATTRACTING PEOPLE DOWNTOWN. WHILE SOME PEOPLE ARE ENJOYING THE ABOVE SEASONAL TEMPERATURES, THIS COUPLE FROM THE NIAGARA REGION WANTED TO SEE SNOW.

>> WE ARE UP FROM DOWN SOUTH. EVERY TIME WE COME FOR CHRISTMAS, WE EXPECT A WINTER WONDERLAND, SO THIS YEAR WAS KIND OF A LITTLE BIT DIFFERENT. IT IS NOT IDEAL, BUT HOPEFULLY THE SNOW WILL COME SOON.
