YOUTH ART ACTIVITY MAGDALENA SUAREZ FRIMKESS: THE FINEST DISREGARD




Magdalena Suarez Frimkess is a Los Angeles painter and sculptor who was born in Venezuela. She makes plates, tea sets, vases, tiles, and figures of people and animals out of clay, then paints them with lots of colorful designs, pictures of friends and family, and cartoon characters. When you look at her work, you will see characters like Minnie and Mickey Mouse, Snoopy, Popeye and Olive Oyl, and more!

The artist often looks at her collection of books to get ideas for her work. In addition to all the cartoon and comic book characters, she paints tributes to ancient Mayan, Japanese, and Greek motifs. Sometimes Magdalena collaborates with her husband Michael, who is a master ceramicist. He will make a classic pot or vase and she will paint it in her distinctive style.

One time Michael made a large lidded pot that Magdalena painted with pictures of her family, her favorite cartoon characters, her friends, and even her backyard lemon tree. They had the idea to customize vases for anybody who wanted to buy them.

When Magdalena paints Minnie Mouse, Minnie gets to wear a different dress, pair of shoes, and purse every time.
