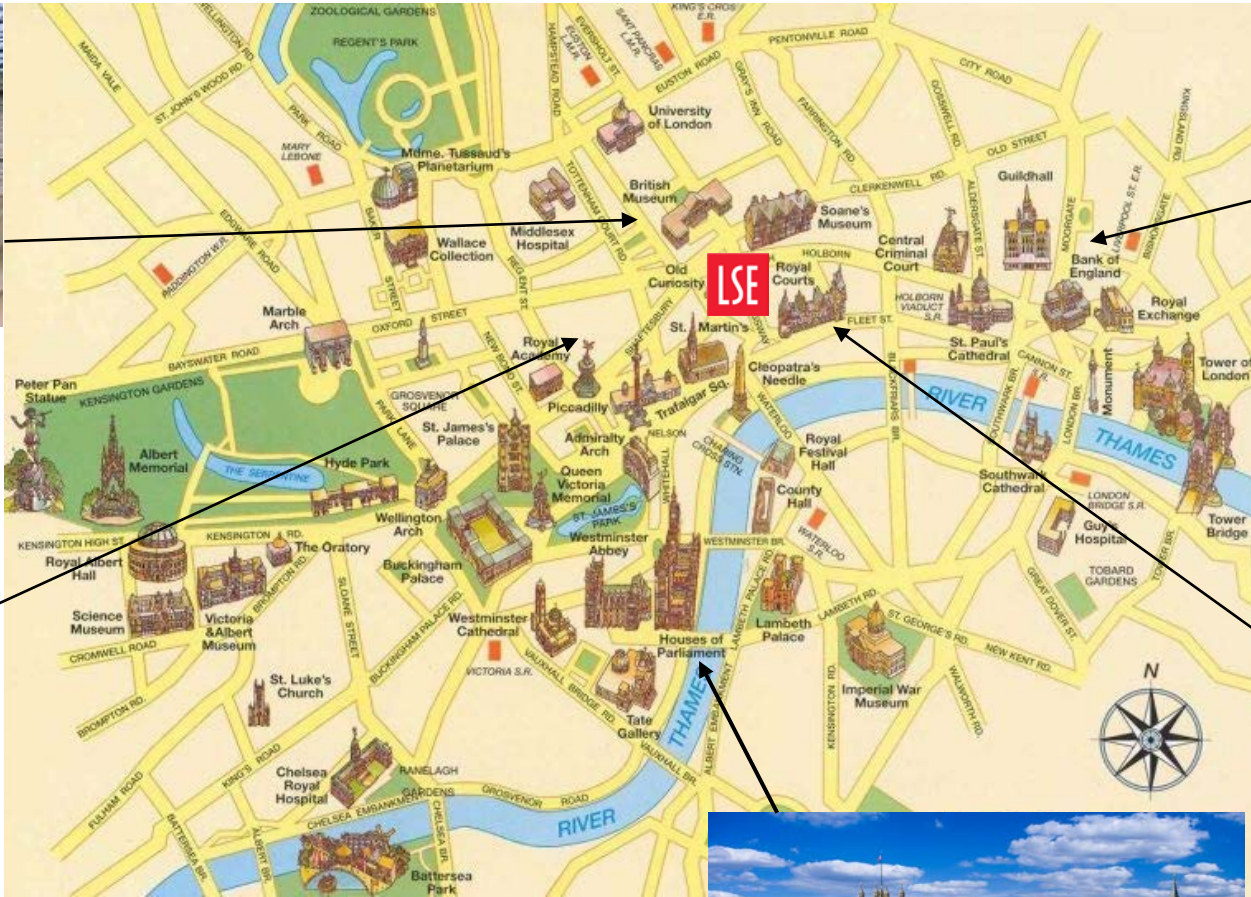

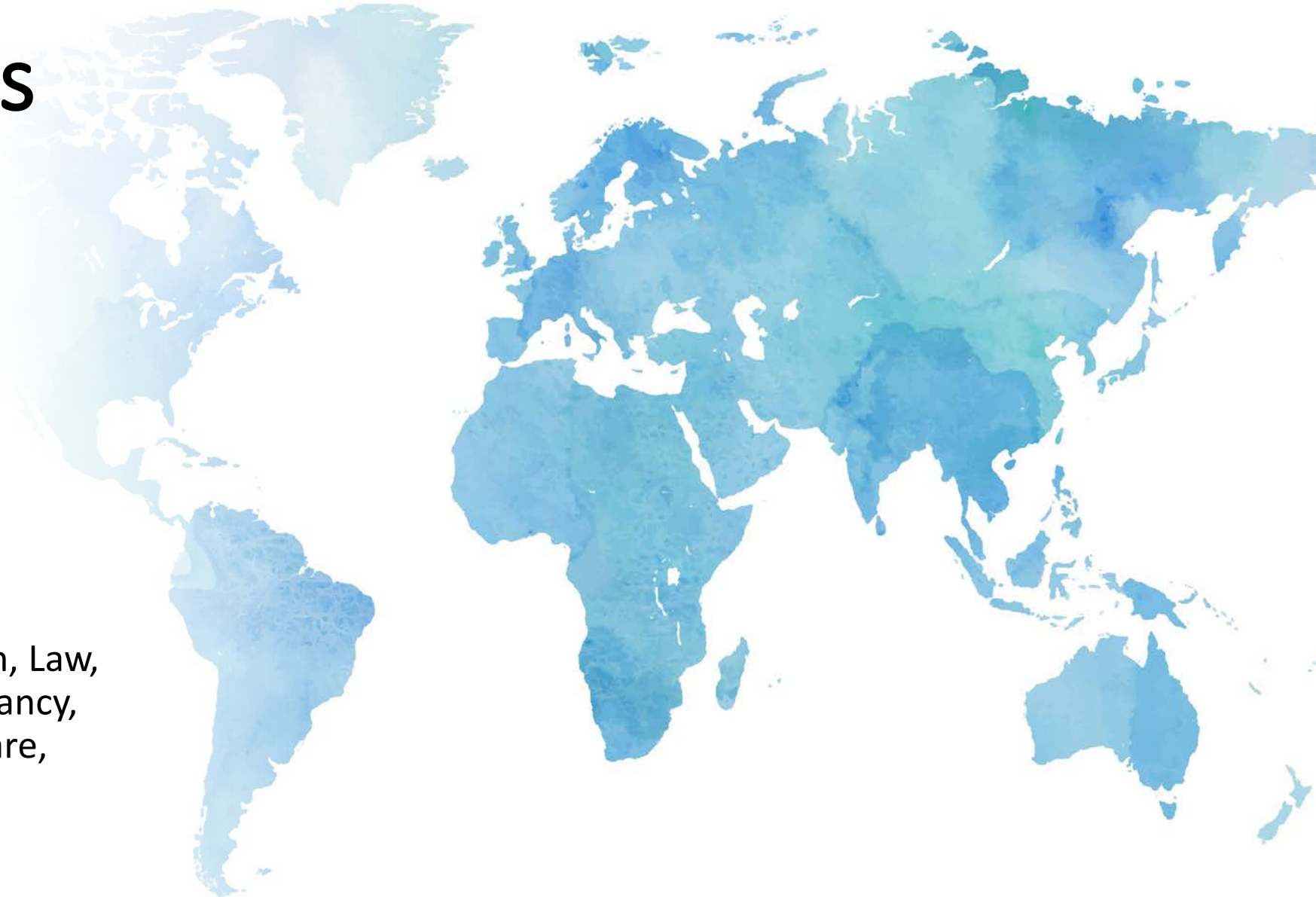

# Master of Public Administration (MPA) Programme

- 2 years, full-time
- For early-stage career. No requirement for prior professional experience.
- Combines methodological discipline and practical application through Capstone Project with external client
- Option to specialise in second year

# Master of Public Policy (MPP) Programme

- Intensive 9-month programme
- For early to mid-stage career professionals. 5+ years professional experience required
- Develop a deeper understanding of how policy, policy-making, and 'craft of government' works
- Shape your career trajectory and develop your professional networks







# MPA in Data Science for Public Policy (MPA-DSPP)

- Welcomed first intake in August 2023
- 2 years, full-time
- Develop core quantitative, technical and analytical tools to address modern policy challenges in an increasingly digital world
- MPA-DSPP Capstone Project
- 4-week programming bootcamp prior to welcome weeks

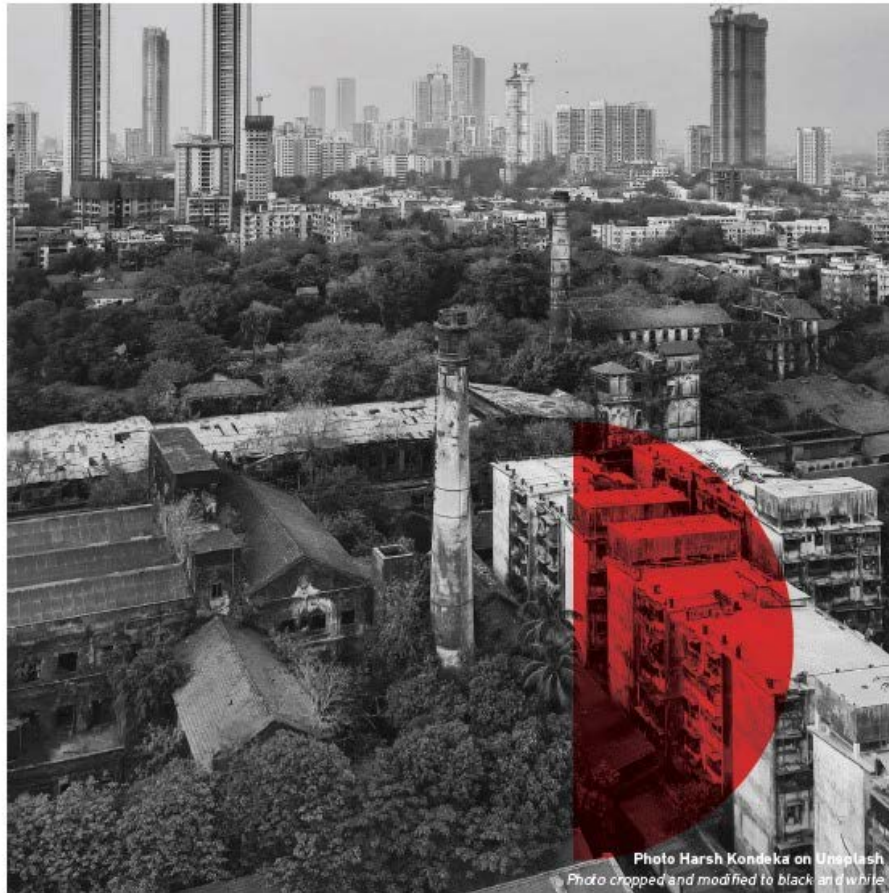

# Programme Entry Requirements

- **Academic requirements**
  - A first or upper second-class honours (2:1) degree or a [non-UK equivalent](#) in any discipline
- **Professional experience**
  - MPP – 5+ years of relevant professional experience
  - MPA, MPA-DSPP and MPA DDs – No formal requirement although students usually have some prior professional experience.
- High level of English language proficiency



# What is policy-relevant experience?

A wide range of professional/voluntary/interning experience can be relevant. The list below is a **non-exhaustive**:

- Work for government agencies
- NGOs/Non-profit organizations/some charity work
- Consulting/advisory roles
- Think tanks/lobbying/special-interest organizations
- Civil-Service roles
- Regulatory work; legal work; compliance work
- Economist roles
- Analyst roles

- Urban planning
- Education
- Development
- Some finance roles, especially those concerned with central banking, regulation or compliance
- Health services
- Defence
- Transportation
- Environment
- Many business or other private-sector roles can also, of course, be policy-relevant

**Please don't be discouraged** if your own experience does not feature in the list above: Selectors are open-minded, so make the case for its relevance in your Statement of Academic Purpose.





# How to Apply

- Online application
- Includes supporting documents
  - CV
  - statement of academic purpose
  - Two references – can be professional
- £95 application fee (includes two programme choices)
- Decisions issued within 8 weeks
- Progress can be checked on Graduate Applicant Portal



# Statement of Academic Purpose

- Two sides of A4 paper (1,000 - 1,500 words)
- For your chosen programmes, outline your:
  - Interest
  - Understanding
  - Suitability
  - Purpose and objectives
  - Focus on the origin of your interest in this subject/area
- Your statement should:
  - describe your academic interests, strengths and background relevant to the programme(s)
  - outline your academic ambitions and/or research interests, and any professional aspirations.

# Application deadlines

- MPA, MPP, MPA-DSPP application deadlines are rolling but we encourage applications by our early deadline **12 January 2024**
- Sciences Po double degree – apply via Sciences Po by **11 February 2024**
- Columbia SIPA double degree – apply via LSE by **17 March 2024** (complete application)
