

This world-class museum dedicated to the U.S. Constitution is a must-see on any visit to Historic Philadelphia. Through interactive exhibits rare artifacts, and live theater, it brings the Constitution to life for visitors of all ages.

Bill of Rights Day Sunday, December 15

In December 1791, the states ratified the first 10 amendments to the Constitution—the Bill of Rights. Every year, the National Constitution Center hosts a celebration to honor the liberties enshrined in these amendments. Visitors can view a copy of the historic Bill of Rights, learn about the first 10 amendments through interactive games and shows, and take a special tour of Signers' Hall to learn about the history of the Bill of Rights and why it was left out of the original U.S. Constitution.

The National Constitution Center is open 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. Wednesday through Sunday. The Center is closed Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day. For more information, visit constitutioncenter.org.

The PHILLY PHLASH® is a visitor-friendly public transport service with stops near all the city's must-see attractions, including Historic District hot spots like the Liberty Bell Center, Museum of the American Revolution and, new this year, the Betsy Ross House.
