procedures	 Application steps and registration for incoming students: 1. After being nominated by the home university, double degree students will receive an e-mail with an access code and instructions to register to our online international student's mobility platform.
	 Students are required to access the online international student's mobility platform and to register within 15 days from the date in which they receive the e-mail as described at point 1. Once the registration form has been submitted, students are required to

Once the registration form has been submitted, students are required to access their personal page from the provided link and to upload the following documents: ID card (for Schengen countries) or passport (for non-EU students), curriculum vitae, Language certificates (if required, check with home University).
	Please, be informed that in order for the students to be officially enrolled, the relevant office may require an updated transcript of records, learning agreement or
	other documents at a later stage. Acceptance/Invitation letter
Acceptance of students	Sapienza University will send to accepted students the Acceptance or the Invitation Letter.
	Invitation letter will be sent to all incoming students starting from:
	- 15 th May for Fall semester nominations;
	 15th November for Spring semester nominations.
	In order for students to get the study visa, the invitation letter will be sent via
	registered mail to the Italian Consulate indicated by the student in his/her application. The same letter will be scanned and uploaded on the student's personal webpage for its download. We do not send the original nor the scan version of invitation letter to the Partner University. <i>Important</i> : Students' arrival needs to be in line with the academic calendar for each semester and with the placement test scheduled for the Italian language course.
Drop out	Drop out need to be communicated to both professor in charge of the double degree programme and to the Non-EU Mobility and International Didactic Agreements Unit (<u>doubledegree.ari@uniroma1.it</u>) by the Home University possibly no later than July 15 th for the Fall semester and no later than January 15 th for the Spring semester.
Learning Agreement (Study plan)	Learning agreement is a study plan (according to the double degree agreement) that the selected student may be requested to fill out in order to check which classes he/she will attend.
Once in Rome	
Arrival at Sapienza	Students are accepted by Sapienza for this duration:
	Fall semester: September - February. Arrival at Sapienza no later than end of September.
	Spring semester: February - July. Arrival at Sapienza no later than end of February.
	Fall and Spring Semester: September - July
	<i>Important</i> : Students' arrival needs to be in line with the academic calendar for each semester and with the placement test scheduled for the Italian language course.
Italian language course	An intensive or regular Italian course is offered by Sapienza both in the Fall and in the Spring semester to all exchange and double degree students. Participation is not compulsory, but it is strongly recommended. Student can indicate their preference





	when filling out the application form. Later/different inscriptions will not be accepted.
Welcome Week	Sapienza International Office organizes a Welcome Week for all incoming students before the beginning of each semester:
	Fall semester: mid-September (date tbc)
	Spring semester: beginning-mid of February (date to tbc)
	Participation of students is strongly recommended.
Attending classes	Classes in Sapienza are open and registration for attending is not required, unless the relevant professors do not provide the students with a different indication. Registration is compulsory for taking exams at the end of the semester.

University structure	
Grading system	The Italian University system is organized in 3 cycles (3+2+3 according to the Bologna system):
	- the 1 st cycle academic degree, that is the " <i>Laurea</i> " (three-year Bachelor's Degree Programmes – 180 ECTS credits), grants access to the
	- 2 nd cycle, the " <i>Laurea Magistrale</i> " (Two-year Master's Degree Programmes – 120 ECTS credits), giving access to the
	- 3 rd cycle doctorate programmes resulting in the PhD degree called " <i>Dottorato di Ricerca</i> ".
	A five - or six - year Single Cycle Graduate Programme (300 or 360 ECTS credits) is offered as well for some degree courses (i.e. Law, Architecture, Engineering, Medicine)
	The <u>European Credit Transfer System</u> (ECTS) is used by Italian universities to evaluate and measure the workload of single courses, as well as entire qualifications. ECTS credits represent the total student workload (class time, individual study, exam preparation, practical work, etc.) needed to complete a module/programme. According to Italian legislation, 1 ECTS corresponds to 1 CFU credit that is equivalent to 25 hours workload. CFU and ECTS are the same.
Transcript of Records	The Student Affairs Office will provide students with a Transcript of records at the end of the mobility period.
Conversion formula	Exams are graded using a grading scale of 30, where 18 is the minimum passing grade and 30 cum laude the highest grade.
	$Voto = \frac{V-Vmin}{Vmax-Vmin} * (Imax - Imin) + Imin$
	 Voto = the final result V = grade to be converted Vmin = minimum grade to pass in the Home University Vmax = maximum grade student can get for an exam in the Home University Imin = 18 (which is the minimum in Italy)
