Evaluation Methods Used: The following testing was done on Chrome v78.0 with WAVE Extension for WCAG 2.1 compliance and WebAIM for section 508 compliance, Firefox v70.0 with FireEyes for WAI-ARIA and Internet Explorer v11 on Windows 10 with NV Access's NVDA screen reader v2019.1, JAWS v18.2, Microsoft's Accessibility Display options (Filter keys and Display/Contrast settings) and standard Keyboard, on Safari on macOS 10.14 (Mojave) with Apples' Accessibility Display options (invert colors, use grayscale, color settings, contrast settings and transparency settings), Zoom options, VoiceOver options and standard Keyboard.
